Quarter Horse:

Build: Well muscled hinquarters; good curvature to the neck; sloping shoulder; short leg bones

Color: A paint colored horse MAY BE REGISTERED as a Quarter Horse as according to the AQHA rulebook, "Breeders should be aware that the American Quarter Horse, while long recognized, identified and promoted as a solid-colored horse, can and does occasionally produce offspring with overo paint characteristics." However, if the white markings fall outside of the allowed limits, an overo, "shall be eligible for registration by AQHA only if it is parentage verified through DNA typing the offspring, its sire and its dam."
