-At the time of application, students must have a minimum high school GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 unweighted scale and upload an official transcript showing that with their application.

-Students must earn a minimum ACT score of 18 in each category (writing score is not required) or a minimum SAT Math score of 490 and Evidence-Based Reading & Writing score of 490. All test scores must come from a single test, and must be uploaded by the application deadline.

Current high school juniors are eligible to apply. Full-ride scholarship covers a student's tuition, room, board, and expenses for four years of undergraduate study and leadership training. Anyone of any background, pursuing any academic discipline of study, may apply to this non-partisan, need-blind, program. Coolidge scholars must possess a distinguished academic record and have pursued and succeeded in the most rigorous course of study available to them. Criteria: Academic Excellence, Interest in Public Policy and Appreciation for Coolidge Values, Humility and Service
