UPDATES



Grant Funding for MTSS

The California Department of Education in partnership with the Orange County Department of Education and the Butte County Office of Education is excited to share a new grant funding and training opportunity for school sites, consortia and/or county offices. Applications began September 20, 2021 and the deadline to apply is October 20, 2021 by 5:00 pm PST.

The school and consortium grant is intended to provide funding for schools to enable their staff to receive online professional learning and coaching through the California MTSS Pathway Certification for Schools course. Eligible staff, including administrators, teachers, school counselors, school psychologists, school-based mental health clinicians, and paraeducators will complete the course during the grant phase. The site administrator will engage in regular coaching and technical assistance provided by an assigned coach. Expected outcomes include improved school conditions and climate and improved outcomes for all learners. Grant awardees must commit to ensuring a minimum of 90% of their school staff complete the course within the grant period ending on June 30, 2026.

During the application review process, per the trailer bill, priority will be given to schools who have a high number of unduplicated pupils and previous district level training on CA MTSS foundations through either the CA SUMS Phase 1 grant or subsequent training provided by their local COE or LEA.

County offices may apply for funding to help build capacity in their local office to coach schools implementing the CA MTSS framework. County office staff will identify staff to complete the online course and become certified CA MTSS coaches. County office funding may be used to support time to coach awardee sites/consortia in their county.

Applications are available starting: September 20, 2021

Application Deadline: October 20, 2021 by 5:00 pm. PST

Award Announcement: December 1, 2021

The conference will consist of a combination of live and prerecorded sessions and will feature renowned keynote speakers: Teacher of the Year Keisa Brown and Professor John Hattie. 

New Current Context: Redlining from California History-Social Science Project



Use the recent *Current Context*, "Redlining," to explore the social and environmental consequences of discriminatory housing policy decisions from the 1930s and how these policies continue to shape Americans' lived experiences. Students will consider linkages to social and climate justice issues nationally and in their own communities and learn about how some cities are tackling these entrenched issues. A teaching support page outlines relevant resources for deepening students' engagement in the

history, government, geography, ethnic studies, and economics classrooms. Recommended maps and databases can prompt small group and full class discussions about California-specific redlining connections.







Bridging Self-Identity and Social Justice: How to Spark the Joy of Literacy in the Spanish Heritage Language Classroom


Suggested Audience: World language teachers, dual language program staff, instructional leaders,



In this three-day workshop, participants will understand the importance of personal narrative writing to amplify student voices and leverage their assets as diverse learners. Teachers will be encouraged to explore recent issues of social justice through authentic texts by U.S. Latinx and Latin American writers. By engaging in strategies to promote literacy and reigniting a passion for reading and writing, participants will assist students in crafting their voice as a bridge to engage with more complex texts. Participants will receive resources, including student samples, teaching strategies, and authentic texts, and be encouraged to exchange additional resources as a community of teachers and learners.
