A magical or spiritual practice can offer.

I think a lot of people have a lot of like.

Kind of ritual contexts or other things like and maybe like religious situations where they look really didn't consent to it and it could be a really cool and beautiful experience if you consent to

it and you want it is, you know, not maybe so much if you're, you know, have it forced upon you. And so I think a lot of people have some barriers surrounding that stuff as well.

Your unseen supports and your future self, because that's like.

You know, because a lot of people might think that they don't have any support, right? Meaning people here, like in this material plane.

Brought that up.

One thing that I started doing a while back when I was thinking about the idea of like time Magic is a simple like meditation in the morning where like I think about, you know, my self existing in all these different times. But I kind of stand in the same place. I know I'm not actually in the same place like.

The Earth has moved and we're all.

00:08:28 Luxa

Greening through.

00:08:30 Luxa

Space breakneck speeds all the time, you know, similarly enough. You know, this idea of kind of connecting with the past self and the future self through the present self and sort of like you know, reaching out to the future self for guidance and then also reaching back to the past self to offer its support and guidance and like.

You know, forming that relationship with yourself, it's like if I'm gonna do this every day, I can count on myself in the future to be offering myself support. So it's almost like, even if you're sort of a scientific material.

Realist, you can still like say, well, that's actually for sure true, because I'm making it happen, which I think is actually a really cool way of doing magic is is making things happen like that. So yeah.

Yeah. Oh, that brings up a good point about making things happen, because there's kind of a lot of and you, you know.

Kind of. You're more of sort of chaos magic, so this probably doesn't phase you at all.

But there's a lot of like, yeah. Yeah, I figured so. But there is a lot of, like, at least in some of the circle I'm in, where there's, you know, either Western ceremonial magic or stuff like that, you know, and a lot of it, a lot of the things I do not a lot, but some of the things I do are, like, theoretical and like, considered.

But not everything I do.

Is I do do material world stuff. So what is your perspective on doing?

Like doing magic that makes changes and maybe even doing magic that makes changes for your material either benefit or something.

OK, yeah, this is.

00:10:08 Luxa

A great question. I think it's kind of complex and nuanced and I think that in order to answer, I might have to tease apart some of what I might consider a little bit of like classism and stuff that's inherent in this, this like kind of split between thinking about these things, the idea that like.

Ohh sure.

00:10:26 Luxa

At least to to my ear, the idea that, like high magic, is that which we, you know, do in our fancy robes and our fancy expensive, you know, materials for, you know, like. And this is like to to make us more divine, to get us more in touch with, like, this higher divine power, whereas like low magic or sorcery is like.

Gross. That's what you have to do. And you have to pay the bills. Like. Yeah, like that's for Poors, I mean. And I'm not saying that that's exactly like what the thinking is there, but like I do think that

Yeah, yeah, yeah.

00:10:56 Luxa

Like, you know, whatever you're doing, like whether it's making changes to make your, you know, living circumstances more supportable for doing maybe what some people would consider higher work. You know, you have to start somewhere. Like you're always creating changes. And I think that oftentimes, at least from my experience.

You know, creating like these things kind of come together, like doing high quote and low quote magic. Oftentimes both result and both inner and outer results in in the world and in yourself like I I think that there's a sort of for me a little bit of.

I guess maybe like a little bit of a fallacy in separating those things. I do a lot of what a lot of people wouldn't consider to be like theurgy and high magic and stuff like that. Like I'm very into playing around with like, very old tech and kind of feeling out how it works and then adapting it for my own purposes, like the classic that I've been loving to play around with for the last. I don't know, maybe.

Nine months or so is the headless right. This is kind of like one of those classic things that.

Everybody and their siblings loved you. Play with so, like, yeah, just sort of. I do a lot of DoD work and stuff like that too, but I also don't think there's anything wrong with, you know, people.

Creating like using magic to create the type of situation that they need to support. You know, Maslow's higher, higher things on the pyramid, right? Yeah.

Yeah, beautifully explained. Yeah, I like that thinking too. And I like that, you know, nonsensically. But put together like, uh, like, what high magic is? And maybe what?

People might think of low magic is very funny. I'm not and I'm not to like not either anybody's perspective. I know that there's a lot of different ways of like approaching.

Who has done the group?

00:12:45 Merrily

Ohh for sure.

All this stuff, and there's all kinds of magic that like I, you know, I wouldn't. I'm not saying like, I'm into doing all types of magic all the time. Like everybody should be discerning and think it through and make sure that it's what makes sense for you and what feels right for you. And and all of the rest of.

It so yes.

00:13:06 Merrily

Ah, so good.

00:13:08 Merrily

And I also like to think too, because I am in my practice, I look at and meditate on the Kabbalah quite a lot, quite a lot. And in the Kabbalah it's very much, you know, they hit it over your head so many times. That catcher, which is the quote UN quote, highest fear, and then malkuth is the, quote, UN quote lowest fear where we're.

They're residing in consciously, they're connected, they're very much connected. They're overlapped. So to me, it's like if you're making changes here.

It's it's connected to the higher. Exactly what you said. It's just like, yeah.

Yeah. I mean, if I'm. I'm, I'm not like.

Like, you know, Western Hermeticism version of Cabala scholar at all, or anything. But if I'm not mistaken, it kind of exists on these, like, orders of magnitude. Like, you've got the tree, and then it kind of leads to, like, another tree. That's like, so that makes sense that it would be connected, right, like.

So perfect now. So you kind of like laid this wonderful ground work. Can you describe for people who maybe aren't very familiar with what chaos magic is according to your own perspective?

Yeah, sure.

00:14:16 Luxa

So it's a highly individualized practice. So preface this by saying that so every class magician is going to have a little bit of a different way of thinking about it and practicing it and all of that stuff. But I will give you a little bit of that in a nutshell, like from my own perspective, this is something that I talk about on my podcast a lot. So if people are interested in learning more in depth, that's something that they.

Get into there. There's a lot of nuance to all this.

This Curtis started out with like a basic premise of my own, which is like it seems to me that humans have a sort of, like psychological infrastructure that's like set up for spirituality and ritual and things like that. That's kind of like part of.

Our secret sauce as creatures, if you will, I think, and it seems like looking at history and all.

00:15:01 Luxa

All the other.

00:15:02 Luxa

Places. This is something that often is Co opted by like authority structures or like con people or.

00:15:09 Luxa

Predators or whatever to to use it for their own means instead of the constructive means that it might otherwise be used for for the individual. So a do-it-yourself approach to spirituality I think can help a person sidestep many of those issues with spirituality in general.

So Chaos magic is something that's allowed me to kind of reconcile.

00:15:34 Luxa

Spiritual woo, whatever, and kind of hard scientific ways of knowing and understanding like ways of putting these things together and synthesizing them like into useful tools and other things. So this is the context in which I work. It can look a lot of, you know, very similar to like a lot of.

00:15:55 Luxa

Pattern like eclectic witchcraft practices that we see very commonly where people have kind of taken what works from them from various systems or traditions and created their own like approach, their own kind of. I've heard people say like this is my own personal religion and I'm the only person who practices it and that kind of thing which is red.

For chaos magic, some touchstones, like in terms of like praxis, like some people might think about are like Sigil Magic, Hyper sigils, pop culture, magic things along those lines, but definitely not limited to it. I think a lot of chaos magicians.

00:16:32 Luxa

Like to explore a lot of really kind of old traditions just from a chaos magic perspective. So.

00:16:41 Luxa

Where it diverges from a lot of the like eclectic witchcraft practices that I described earlier. Is that chaos magic tends to be informed by a sort of like theoretical framework, which includes things like paradigms and magical models.

So in cast magic, we're not ever really making like ontological assertions. If you will or like statements about like what for real is actually going on behind the scenes with magic like in some traditions, they're like oh, no, for real. It's definitely this. God, this God definitely exists, and they do this. And this is like what it is, right and.

That's magic.

00:17:18 Luxa

It's like, OK, well, that's a paradigm like this is one way of looking at it. And in order to like, play this game, I'm gonna, you know, enter into this mode of thinking. But I'm also, you know, knowing that this is still a paradigm. This is still a game that I'm playing. I'm not completely investing all the way per say.

Unless I'm actually in the moment doing ritual, that's when I'm completely investing, and that's when I'm, you know, using the.

00:17:46 Luxa

That belief, you know, the the idea, that belief being something that can be used in intentional ways for magical purposes is kind of another little kind of key component of a lot of chaos magic practices. So like, rather than having this like fixed state of belief that like, ohh yeah, like this is it for sure. It's just when I'm doing that ritual.

Like so, when I'm for instance, like praying to the goddess that I like to work with or whatever, like while I'm in that moment, like I'm really like letting it go, like really kind of surrendering to.

That and then after I'm no longer in that, you know, circle, that magical circle or container of ritual, I can step back to my normal, everyday agnosticism about many things in the world.

So this is a way that I find really works for me and it it's been something that's been really useful for me and it's also allowed me to gain a lot of different perspectives about a lot of different things. And I think it allowed me to.

Gain a lot of empathy and I just understanding about how the world works in general. So yeah, if nothing is true, everything is permitted or because all truths are conditional, there might be infinite possibilities there, right? So hopefully that's lucid enough to be doing.

That's great.

Oh oh, it's making me think ohh cause you're doing So what you said. I I like, you know, I think This is why chaos magic, you know, was so groundbreaking. When it hits years and years ago. But it's still like in very much existence today and probably getting more strong is because of that freedom and.

You know people, you know, cause human beings are curious. They want to explore and, you know, figure this out, especially something so important as like your relationship to.

You know what the heck you're doing here?

00:19:45 Luxa

Yeah, absolutely.

00:19:47 Merrily

But I did have a question. Since you do you know you interviewed quite a few people have any of your guests kind of influenced you in some way of like how you approach magic? You don't have any names, but just curious. Yeah. I mean, I've been. I don't want to. Like, I don't want to name these.

I'm very nervous that I'll accidentally forget somebody and feel like a total ****** because I've spoken to some of people that have been, yeah, I've gotten to meet some people that I've really looked up to and respected and it's.

Oh oh, totally.

And really, really amazing. And so, yeah, I've definitely had the opportunity to speak to people that have been inspirations to me and who I've, you know, been, like, huge fan girl of and.

Cool. OK, so I know one of the main things that you're working on is called the green mushroom.

So I'm curious now I have. I feel like when I have these questions I I have them backwards, but so if you can help the guests understand or the guests the audience understand what the green mushroom project is and then kind of what inspired you to get involved and start.

Start it.

00:21:00 Luxa

Yeah, absolutely. So I think I'll start out with the sort of biological metaphor that inspired this in order to describe what it is. Yeah. So maybe the questions weren't backwards, but.

If we think about the symbiotic relationship, like a relationship where both of the organisms are getting a benefit out of it, a beneficial symbiosis that some types of fungi, the types that produce mushroom, have with some types of.

Trees. A lot of these are conifers, but they're not limited to conifers. There's this sort of really interesting thing that happens where the forest is kind of connected underground by this mycelial web that these fungi form, and it allows the trees to kind of communicate with each other and to share resources. And it's not very well understood.

Yet, but the more that we learn about it, the more interesting and.

00:21:56 Luxa

It's, you know, complicated it. It looks. So there's this really interesting kind of biological metaphor that I wanted to play with there. So here with the mushroom project, if the magical practitioners are like these trees, the grey mushroom high procedural is like the underground mycelial web, which.

Connects us and supports us and allows us to like, you know, share resources and communicate and other interesting magical things. The word hifo.

00:22:26 Luxa

Is from Latin from net, so it means web so so web digital. It's kind of inspired by the linking Sigil that the dcam you came up with a while back. It's a similar type of tech, only this one is for a different thing than the less digital was created for. But yeah.

Pretty much inspired by that work and.

00:22:50 Luxa

We started it back in 2020. It's sort of.

00:22:56 Luxa

A large scale on growing.

00:22:59 Luxa

Excuse me? We started back in 2020 as a sort of, like, large scale ongoing group magical working, which is focused on like, as I said, building connections right like the.

00:23:11 Luxa

The Hifo web connects us a lot of this is like fostering creativity, like there's a lot of creative people, a lot of the magic that we do is creative in nature and artistically based and things like that, where a lot of us are very into things like hypersexual's and stuff like that.

We wanted to empower individuals to become more agentic through using magic and esoteric technology, kind of like I described earlier with with what I did with my podcast and my name and all that stuff. You know, there's all kinds of things can be done with that stuff and we wanted to have a space where people could, you know, experiment with that stuff.

And through this, we also wanted to build solidarity and kind of strengthen our position against hate groups, which is a thing that unfortunately we see sort of in on the rise within occult and new age circles and other places in our society. So this was the case back in 2020, and it's still the case.

Now, so yes.

00:24:12 Merrily

Oh, very cool. I love the concept around it and then how it's being implemented and then how you're kind of using that sort of sounds like kind of like combined attention, right. And that's very powerful and magic is the attention and.

Focus and especially around things that you know as individuals, we feel like we can't have an effect on like you know, so uh that's so cool.

Yeah, one of the one of the things that we do is like every Friday night, we light a candle with the mushroom sigil on it together. And we say the statements project of resistance, which I'd be happy to read for you if you.

Would like to hear.

00:24:47 Merrily

It please. OK.

00:24:49 Luxa

Come on. So this is the green Mushroom project statement of resistance, which we do read and then light a candle at midnight Eastern on Friday nights. We usually have it be a green candle.

Picking that in.

Resist by maintaining sovereignty of the self.

Resist by maintaining love of the self.

Resist with acts of radical kindness, focus on the path to better times.

I like the sign off. That's great. Yeah. Yeah. It's kind of our. Amen. Can I get a book? Yeah. So you might have noticed. I know you're into planetary magic. You might have noticed the planetary tie INS here. We're doing this on Friday nights.

Yeah, it's. I mean it has like the same energy. That's awesome.

We've got love and pleasure as part of it, so we've got a lot of.

Fusion energy going on here. We found that to be very helpful for, like, keeping **** chill and also for creative endeavors too. So.

Oh, I like that. Yeah, you associated the Friday energy with creativity cause why not it makes.

Sense I've. Yeah, I found it to be a very useful energy for that stuff.

You think? Good tip. I love it.

You have so many, so many things that you're doing the next one that I was.

If I know this one so much, but it's, I think it's on your Patreon, but it's called project specs.

Oh yes, actually this is very much related to the green mushroom project, because this is a little this is a thing.

At Frederic Damiana and Guillermo X have.

00:26:36 Luxa

And actually armored some some folks and I were talking about, you know, wanting to do some kind of pop culture political magic. And this was something that emerged as being a really kind of fun and interesting thing to try out. So project specs as in, like, spectacles.
