K-5 GRADING POLICY

The following grading policy serves to inform our entire school community about how grades are earned and is aligned to accurately capture meaningful data about student performance in accordance with New York State learning standards.

This document outlines how courses are graded, the scale of marks awarded and when and how often students receive grades. Report cards are issued multiple times throughout the year, at the end of each marking period, they are accessible to parents through the NYCSA.

Students will receive grades in each of the following courses: ELA (Reading, Writing, Listening & Speaking), Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Academic and Personal Behaviors, and Social-Emotional Development. Parents and guardians will have the opportunity to speak to their child's teacher about grades during scheduled Parent Teacher Conferences, as well as have opportunities throughout the school year during parent engagement time to discuss student progress. This is especially important for marking periods that don't align with Parent-Teacher Conferences.

How Classes/Courses Are Graded:

Report card grades are based on a combination of measures. Student grades are based on academic progress and performance, considering students' entire body of work in each subject. Grades reflect students' level of understanding and skills in a subject as of a specific point in time. The grade for each marking period reflects the teacher's evaluation of student work for that marking period based on a combination of assessments, performance tasks, class participation, projects, classwork, and homework. Students with I.E.P.s will be graded in accordance with their promotional criteria.
