Wahiawa

Wahiawa is a census-designated place (CDP) located in Honolulu County, Hawaii. The city is located in the central valley between two volcanic mountains. Wahiawa means 'place of the wa people'. It is home to a large population of Native Hawaiians and is surrounded by the lush greenery of the Honolulu Valley. Here's a look at some of the local attractions.

Dole Plantation

A trip to the Dole Plantation is a great way to spend an afternoon in the Hawaiian Islands. It is located on Oahu's north shore, just ten minutes away from the quaint town of Haleiwa. Dole Plantation is conveniently located near several popular tourist destinations on the island, including the Waikiki Resort Hotel. Kuhio Avenue, Herbert Street, and 6th Avenue are three nearby streets, as are Highway 1/Lunalilo Freeway, which is heading toward downtown Honolulu. If you are driving, there is also Highway 2 which is just a few minutes away.

If you plan to visit the Dole Plantation while you are in Hawaii, make sure you bring a comfortable bag. Also, wear sunblock and a hat, as there is no shade inside the maze. You'll be walking a lot, so bring a hat and sunglasses. It will keep you cool in the sun and you'll enjoy your time at the Dole Plantation!

Kukaniloko Birthing Stones

In Wahiawa, the Kukaniloko Birthing Stones are a sacred site. The rows of 18 pohaku, or stones, are arranged in a walkway. These stones were placed along imaginary lines that point to important locations on the island. While visitors aren't allowed in the sacred area, they can recognize the stones by shape and imagine births and classes.

Although the birthing stones are no longer in use, they still serve as a sacred site to all Hawaiians. This site lies between the Koolaus and Waianaes mountain ranges. The birthplace of many high chiefs, including Kamehameha the Great, was believed to take place here. The birthing site remained important for Hawaiians through the nineteenth century and into the twentieth century.

Schofield Barracks museum

Located in central Oahu, the Schofield Barracks is an important part of the local history. The American Army settled central Oahu in the early 1900s. It served in the Pacific during WWII, Korea, and Vietnam. It was also the birthplace of the Army Air Corps. Notable soldiers include Amelia

Earhart, Sir Kingsford-Smith, Wheeler, and Captain William J. Hickam. Today, the museum features exhibits of the Division's history.

The museum is small, but is definitely worth a visit. The museum is housed in an historic building, which used to be a post library. Inside, you'll find military combat equipment and other artifacts. You'll also find a Vulcan air defense system, as well as a period display of the 25th Infantry Division. There is even a Japanese atomic bomb.

Tropic Lightning Museum

The Tropic Lightning Museum is a cultural attraction in Wahiawa, Hawaii. This small, educational museum supports public education and research. It hosts educational programs and special events and is supported by ticket sales and memberships. Donations also help support the museum. For more information, visit the website. Tropic Lightning Museum in Wahiawa, Hawaii is located at 239 Wright Ave., 15 miles from downtown Wahiawa.

The museum is free for people with military IDs. The entrance is through Lyman Gate on Kunia Road. Upon entering the museum, present your ID and a photo ID. After that, you must complete a safety check. This museum is open Monday through Friday. There are special activities on Living History Day and other special events. The museum is closed on Sundays. If you want to visit without a military ID, you need to register your car at the Lyman Gate before entering the building.

Kailua Beach Park

For those looking to spend some time on the water, the clearwater beach at Kailua Beach Park is a great place to go. It is known for its fine sand and convenient facilities. It also offers a range of water sports for all ages. During the winter months, the beach is closed to visitors. In summer, it's open to the public for a fun day of swimming and other water activities.

Watersports enthusiasts love Kailua Beach Park for its white powder sand and azure-blue, calm water. Small children should enter the water around the stream that enters the sea. There are lifeguards stationed at several spots along the shore. Kitesurfing is also popular in this area. For those who aren't into watersports, there are many rentals available here.

Lanikai Pillboxes

One of the best ways to see the island's beautiful landscape is to climb the Lanikai Pillboxes, a short hike in Lanikai Beach. This hike offers panoramic views of Lanikai Beach, the neighborhood, and the islands of Moloka'i and Maui. There are several ways to climb this trail. The top is covered with graffiti and has windows. While it isn't very challenging, there are some areas that are a little slippery.

The Lanikai Pillbox hike, also known as the Kaiwa Ridge Trail, is one of the most popular hikes on Oahu. This short hike offers spectacular views of the ocean, the Ko'olau mountains, and Kailua

town. It is also relatively easy, but it can be a bit strenuous, especially on hot days. Once you've completed the Lanikai Pillbox hike, you'll be glad you did!
