- Develop appropriate solo/ensemble acting technique for theatre.
- Develop technical theatre ability including: Set/prop construction and costume/make-up design/technique.

Assessments and Performances: (Please see <u>Performing Arts Calendar</u> for Specific dates)

- A weekly learning engagement grade—following the guidelines as listed (Formative Assessment):
- Prompt: Students will be counted tardy if they are not in their chair with their music when the bell rings.
- Prepared: No gum, food, beverages (other than water) or candy in rehearsal.
 - Students will have: Libretto/vocal book and pencil. Students are expected to keep the books in good condition. Lost or damaged books will incur a fee for replacement literature.
- Polite: Each student will treat the teacher, aides, and each other respectfully.
- Positive Mental Attitude: Each student is expected to have a positive attitude, show improvement and adhere to classroom and school policies. (Refer to the Webber student handbook and discipline ladder for further clarification.)
- Produce: Students are expected to show their own personal best growth in skill, teamwork, responsiveness each day.
- Participate: Every student is expected to actively participate and contribute to class and our performance.
- 2. Performance/Dress rehearsal grade (Summative Assessment)

**There will be times when students work independently in MTP/Drama. They are expected to act with integrity at all times!

Required Materials:

- Black Shoes (For the Performance): Can be sneakers or dress shoes, anything you can "dance" or move in.
- Costumes: Students may be asked to wear articles of their own clothes as part of their costumes. It is never required to purchase new costume items, and I encourage students to borrow whenever possible. Please let me know if you have trouble acquiring a specific requested item. (For example: if everyone has to wear a black polo, and you don't own one, try to borrow one somewhere first or visit a thrift store.)

Performance/Dress Rehearsal Grade Rubric:

- 4 Reporting on time for call, good behavior, appropriate dress, and participation throughout the entire performance
- 3.5 Reporting late (after the call time) good behavior and participation throughout the entire performance
- 3 Excused Absence due to illness, religious conflict that was pre-arranged with Ms. Hampson at <u>least 4 weeks in advance</u>
- 2 Reporting on time, good behavior, but not in appropriate dress
- 1 Reporting on time, but poor participation/behavior during performance
- 0 Unexcused absence
