Meeting called to order by Joanna Walsh at 10:08 a.m.

**Co-Chair Update:**

Mental Health: April 30<sup>th</sup> Out of Darkness walk was well attended and took place at DHS. They raised over \$30,000 for the American Society for Suicide Prevention. We are hoping they will hold it again next year.

Mental Health first aid training is next week on the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> from 8:00am – 1:30pm.

5<sup>th</sup> Grade Committees: Joanna sent details and a reminder to co-chairs regarding the 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Committees. Each elementary school has a \$50 and a t-shirt cap per student.. \$50 should include all costs except the 5<sup>th</sup> graders gift to each school. The 5<sup>th</sup> grade gift has a cap of \$2,000; a gift donation form must be completed and submitted to the administration. Only PTO events celebrating 5<sup>th</sup> grade graduation can be advertised on your wires or through room-parents. If there is an off-site, non-pto event, it cannot be advertised on wires or through room parents; the event can only be advertised on social media or through school principals.

2023/2024 Contact Information: Joanna is sending a contact spreadsheet to all co-chairs to complete for next year's executive board, Parent Awareness Rep and CDSP reps. This spreadsheet will be shared among CDSP so contact information is all centralized and easy to access.

Christ Tranberg: Diane and Joanna met with Chris Tranberg to discuss his successor and transition. This year's enrichment committees were very collaborative and Dr. Tranberg would like to streamline enrichment events among the elementary schools; the principals have asked the enrichment committees to pilot one program among all 5 schools for next year. Joanna would encourage SpED and DEI rep to attend enrichment meetings or to have a look at the options to ensure we are meeting the needs of all students.

Insurance: The new Tulip, Gather Guard, doesn't have anything specifically about the SAM clause so Joanna has asked Sheila to look into this and confirm we can use it for our visitors.

Budget: The RTM voted on Monday to approve the BOE Budget for 2023/2024. July 1 is the first day of the new fiscal year.

HHR Construction: The HHR Building Committee is having a meeting at each school to discuss the construction and answer any questions. Construction is scheduled to begin mid-August instead of mid-July because they need to go back out to bid materials. Please encourage your parents to attend and your principals to forward slides to the parent community.

Personnel: The district has many open positions: Chris Tranberg, Royle Principal, Royle Assistant Principal, Tokeneke SESS AP, DHS SESS Department Chair and head of Guidance.

District is reporting a healthy candidate pool and expects to announce an Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum by the end of May.

Extra-Curricular Activities: The BOE has asked the CIAC – to do a review of extracurricular activities. The CIAC has a consulting wing and for a reasonable price they will create and present a report at the retreat regarding athletics and clubs. The goal is to encourage equity between activities that aren't athletics and within athletics.
