

THE TITLE MUST BE WRITTEN IN ENGLISH WITH A MAXIMUM OF 14 WORDS AND USING TIMES NEW ROMAN TYPE FONT (12 pt bold, capital letters, 1 Space)

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ABSTRACT (10 pt bold, capital letters)

The Abstract is written in English using Times New Roman type font, size 10pt, and one space between the lines. The Abstract should be an objective representation of the article. The Abstract must include the research aim and method, which cover the main methods applied, including samples/participants, instruments, collecting data technique, analyzing data technique, the results, and the impact of your study. The Abstract must be between 150-250 words. There must be 2-5 keywords (phrases). Each phrase in Keywords should be separated by a commas (,).



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INTRODUCTION (11pt bold, capital letters)

The introduction must be clear and written descriptively. The introduction must

contain at least five things, namely (1) the author presents trends and phenomena related to the topic raised in the article supported by reference sources or

theoretical literature and relevant research results, as well as a presentation of issues explored in the topic ; (2) how is the response of researchers related to the issue? Try to have expert opinions on the issue to strengthen the researcher's argument; (3) how previous research is related to the issues presented. Then, where is the gap between the research conducted and previous studies? The results of previous research must be relevant to the research topic; (4) how the novelty or gap of the research carried out is supported by relevant theories and sourced from primary sources; and (5) how the focus of the research is carried out. Researchers can write the purpose or the research problem descriptively in the last paragraph of this introduction.

Articles must be written in English using *Ms. Word*, the page format is two columns (except for the title, author's name, abstract, label and figure), and the font type used for the article content is Times New Roman size 11 *pt*, one space. Articles are written on A4 paper (maximum 20 pages) with 3 cm top, bottom, left and right margins. The article should be written with even right and left margins (*justified*), and the first line of the paragraph (*first line*) should be 1 cm. Each page must have a page number in the middle. If the article is written in Indonesian and there are words in a foreign language in the manuscript, the words should be in *italics*.

The citation should use the APA Style 7 version. One – two author(s) should write the last of their name, then the reference year. If there are three or more authors, write the first author's last name and et al., then the reference year

METHOD (11pt bold, capital letters)

Methods should be described with sufficient details to allow others to replicate and build on the published results. This section explains the research design, the reasons for the design, the research procedures applied, the population and research samples or participants, research instruments, data collection techniques, and

data analysis techniques. The description should be in the past tense.

RESULT AND DISCUSSION (11pt bold, capital letters)

In this section, the research results are presented in a clear and detailed manner. Research results can be presented based on research results at each stage of research or research results that answer each problem formulation or others as long as the research results are visible. Research results should be supported by empirical evidence.

This section may be divided into subheadings. It should provide a concise and precise description of the experimental results, their interpretation, and the experimental conclusions that can be drawn.

The discussion of the research should be comprehensive but still concise and coherent. The findings and their implications should be discussed in the broadest context possible. The discussion must also refer to the theory or results of previous research so that it can be seen whether the research results contradict or support each other with the theory or results of previous research. The following components should be covered in the discussion: How do your results relate to the original question or objectives outlined in the Introduction section (what)? Do you provide an interpretation scientifically for each of your results or findings presented (why)? Are your results consistent with what other investigators have reported (what else)? Or are there any differences?

Data will be presented in tabular form using the format in Table 1. The table uses the 1-column page format and is titled in font size 11. Table content uses font 10. The title is placed above the table. The table is *centered and* referenced in the manuscript. If there is more than one table, they are numbered, for example, Table 1, Table 2, and so on. The table is not presented with vertical lines, and care is taken not to have it cut off by the page.

The image presentation is made *at the center of* the page horizontally in a 1-column page format and referred to in the manuscript. Images are given titles that are

placed below the picture. If there is more than one image, they are numbered, for example, Figure 1, Figure 2, and so on.

CONCLUSION (11pt bold, capital letters)

The conclusion section summarizes the results achieved and answers the problem formulation. In addition, the authors should describe this study's implications and limitations. This section is written descriptively, not numbering, and bulleted..

ACKNOWLEDGMENT (11pt bold, capital letters)

Recognize those who helped in the research, especially funding supporters of your research. Include individuals who have assisted you in your study: Advisors, financial supporters, or many other supporters, i.e., Proofreaders, Typists, and Suppliers who may have given materials

AUTHOR CONTRIBUTIONS (11pt bold, capital letters)

This section must describe each author's contributions, such as conceptualization, methodology, software, validation, formal analysis, investigation, resources, data curation, original draft,

writing – review & editing, visualization, supervision, project administration, and funding acquisition. Please see

<https://www.elsevier.com/authors/policies-and-guidelines/credit-author-statement> for each explanation. Below is a sample of how to write this section:

Author One: Conceptualization, writing - original draft, editing, and visualization;

Author Two: Writing - review & editing, formal analysis, and methodology;

Author Three: Validation and supervision.

REFERENCES (11pt bold, capital letters)

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and the rest from other references. References must be up-to-date, except for the fundamental theories, at least the last five years. References and citations should be written according to *the APA 7th Edition* (American Psychological Association)
