Recommendations before we get started

- Read the Introductory letter and review the course description and syllabus first!

Assignment #1: People in Government Web Activity

Access the <u>People in Government Web Activity</u> here or on the AP Gov Summer Work page. Make a copy to complete this google doc, and please print out this activity at some point and keep it in your notebook. Knowing who the players in government are will help us follow what is happening as it relates to what we are studying. **Make sure your information is current** - many of these official positions have new people in the past year. At the end of the Judicial Branch section, you will need to watch 5 brief video segments and provide some explanations of your understanding.

Assignment #3: The Constitution and Amendments Annotated Notes

<u>Read</u> and <u>Take Notes</u> on the Constitution - A helpful resource while reading the Constitution is to use the interactive features of the <u>National Const. Center's website</u>. By clicking on the Preamble and each article/amendment, it provides actual text AND it also provides explanations that may clarify tricky passages or complex concepts.

(Read the Amendments – they are part of the Constitution too and we don't want them to feel left out!)

This should be like note-taking with the significant factual elements, but put into plain language. Use your own words /explanation of concepts – do not rewrite each section. Do this for all 7 articles as well as the 27 amendments. Use an outline or a bulleted format to organize your summary. Include important details, but your assignment should not be longer than the Constitution itself - **Mastering the Constitution is essential to your success in this class.**

Assignment #4: The Declaration of Independence & The Articles of Confederation

DUE: July 31

In this assignment you will read and analyze the Articles of Confederation and the Declaration of Independence - two very important documents that precede our Constitution. These documents lay the foundation for how we construct our new republic at the Constitutional Convention.

Make a copy of this google doc (<u>Declaration and Articles Questions</u>) and click on the reading links to find the primary sources on which to base your explanations to the questions. Feel free to explore other resources to help you better understand these primary sources.

Assignment #5: Federalist / Anti-Federalist Arguments during Ratification

DUE: August 15

In this assignment you will read and analyze the arguments from the opposing sides. These arguments demonstrate the disagreements over how limited this new republic would be and what protections would be necessary to provide for individual rights.

Make a copy of this google doc (<u>Federalists / Anti-Federalists</u>) and click on the reading links to find the primary sources on which to base your explanations to the questions.

Click on the link below and take <u>TWO</u> practice tests that reflect the types of civics questions immigrants are expected to answer when they become U.S. citizens. One google doc can display both screenshots.
