Premise

"The Rocketeer: Take to the Galvanic Skies" is an action-packed rollercoaster adventure that takes riders on a thrilling journey to save the city from the ruthless Maroni Gang.

The ride begins at a secret airplane hangar, where riders enter the queue line and discover the story of the Rocketeer, pilot

Cliff Secord. As they make their way through the hangar, they'll see vintage planes and aircraft parts and get a glimpse of the jet pack and gear that Cliff uses to become the Rocketeer. They'll also learn that the Maroni Gang has stolen a military rocket and is threatening to launch it unless the authorities pay up.

Cliff's girlfriend, Jenny Blake, has been taken hostage by the gang in an effort to silence him. Knowing the location of their secret hideout, Cliff races to Jenny's rescue, and that's where the riders come in. They'll join Cliff on his mission, boarding a rollercoaster that simulates the experience of flying through the skies in the Rocketeer's jetpack. The rollercoaster is designed to give riders the sensation of flying, with twists, turns, and drops that mimic the thrill of aerial maneuvers.

Between coaster sections, riders will experience indoor and outdoor dark ride portions, where they'll find new clues and learn story plots that help them understand the full story as they work together with the Rocketeer to save Jenny and the city from the Maroni Gang's evil plan. The ride features art deco and art nouveau elements in its design, providing a unique and immersive aesthetic that is sure to delight visitors.

Get ready for an adrenaline-pumping adventure as you take to the skies with the Rocketeer and save the day!

Back Story

In "The Rocketeer: Take to the Galvanic Skies," the riders are a group of amateur stunt pilots who are enchanted by the idea of flight. Having never experienced flight, they arrive at the airfield in search of Peevy, who is offering flight lessons.

As Peevy shows them around the hangar throughout the queue line, the legendary pilot, Cliff Secord, shows up. The riders are unaware of his secret identity as the Rocketeer.

Cliff is in a rush because he received a strange call from Jenny and must rush to her apartment to check on her.

The queue line ends with the amateur stunt pilots loading into a newly designed and untested plane piloted by Cliff Secord.

Location

"The Rocketeer: Take to the Galvanic Skies" takes place in a section of the theme park dedicated to adventure and thrills. The ride is located in an area replicating an airfield and features an airplane hangar and workshop as the entrance to the queue line.

As riders enter the queue line, they will walk through a vintage airplane hangar, complete with biplanes and triplanes, aircraft parts, and tools, giving them a sense of the 1930s setting and immersing them in the world of the Rocketeer as they go on their first stunt pilot mission.

Ride System

Preshow

The queue line for "The Rocketeer: Take to the Galvanic Skies" begins at a vintage airplane hangar, where riders enter the queue line and discover the story of the Rocketeer, pilot Cliff Secord. As they make their way through the hangar, they'll see vintage planes and aircraft parts and get a glimpse of the jet pack and gear that Cliff uses to become the Rocketeer. They will be welcomed by Peevy, who is offering flight lessons. Unexpectedly, the legendary pilot, Cliff Secord, shows up, and the riders are unaware of his secret identity as the Rocketeer. Cliff is in a rush because he received a strange call from Jenny and must rush to her apartment to check on her. The queue line ends with the amateur stunt pilots loading into a newly designed and untested plane piloted by Cliff Secord.

Story

The ride begins by launching into the sky from the hangar and soaring through 1938 Los Angeles with the rocketeer jetpack. Cliff must get to Jenny's apartment.

In a dark ride scene, now at the apartment, Cliff and the riders discover a messy apartment riddled with bullet holes. Jenny is nowhere to be found.

Cliff looks out the window to find the Maroni gang in a car leaving the apartment.

Once again, Cliff rockets away, flying the rocket plane in pursuit of the black car through the city and hills around Los Angeles.

In the next dark ride scene, Cliff and the riders finally catch up to the Maroni gang at their hideout. They discover Jenny being held hostage, and Cliff must quickly devise a plan to rescue her. However, the Maroni gang notices Cliff and the amateur stunt pilots and opens fire on the Rocketeer.

Eddie Valentine takes Jenny into a small mob plane, and Cliff and the riders must chase them on the next rollercoaster section, dodging bullets as they pursue the plane to a secret rocket complex.

Once at the secret rocket complex, Cliff has Eddie, and his men surrounded. But Eddie has already tied Jenny to a large missile, which he reveals is set to launch and target the city. Eddie proposes a deal; if the Rocketeer lets him and his men go, he will wait to press the radio-controlled launch button, giving Cliff time to untie Jenny before the launch.

Cliff reluctantly agrees, and Eddie and his men leave. However, just as Cliff begins to untie Jenny, Eddie launches the rocket anyways, with Jenny still attached. This creates a thrilling and high-stakes finale to the ride as the riders join Cliff in a desperate race against time to save Jenny and stop the missile from launching.

Cliff shoots off in another rollercoaster section, following the rocket, attempting to save Jenny before the rocket explodes.

In the final moments of the ride, Cliff and the riders set off in pursuit of the rocket-carrying Jenny, dodging obstacles and maneuvering through dangerous terrain in a thrilling roller coaster section. With time running out, they manage to catch up to the rocket. Using his expert piloting skills, Cliff can save Jenny and redirect the rocket to a safe location over the ocean where it can explode without causing any harm to the city.

Back at the airfield, the ride concludes with a final dark ride scene where Cliff, Jenny, and Peevy are reunited and reflect on their adventure. Peevy, who is more interested in the performance of his new plane than the safety of Cliff or Jenny, thanks the riders for testing the plane and suggests they are natural test pilots and should come back for more formal training. The ride ends on a high note, with the riders leaving the airfield feeling exhilarated and inspired by their experience as amateur stunt pilots.

Characters

Cliff Secord (The Rocketeer)

a daring and adventurous test pilot who stumbles upon a jetpack that enables him to fly. He becomes the hero known as The Rocketeer, using his new abilities to fight crime and save the day.

a sleek and shiny gold helmet, a dark red leather jacket, brown canvas pants, and brown boots. The helmet is a full-face mask with black eyes. The jacket is a double-breasted motorcycle jacket.

Jenny Blake

a struggling actress and college student who becomes the damsel in distress in the story. She is kidnapped by the Maroni gang and must be rescued by The Rocketeer.

a 1940s-style Hollywood actress ensemble consisting of a red and white polka dot dress with a sweetheart neckline, white gloves, and red heels. She wears her hair in a classic Hollywood wave and has a white and gold rocket emblem pin on her dress.

Peevy

a skilled mechanic and inventor who helps The Rocketeer with his equipment and is a mentor and confidant.

light blue mechanic pants with a dirty beige button-up shirt and rolled-up sleeves. He wears a ball cap with an embroidered rocketeer emblem. Peevy also wears a brown leather tool belt and black work boots and has an oil-stained rag in his back pocket.

Eddie Valentine

the leader of the Maroni gang, seeks to distract The Rocketeer while he threatens to blow up the city to exploit money from the mayor.

Valentine's costume is a sleek black suit with pinstripes, a white dress shirt, a black tie, and shiny black shoes. He also wears a black fedora hat.

Maroni Gang

group of ruthless mobsters who work for Eddie Valentine and pose a threat to The Rocketeer and his allies.	The Maroni Gang's costumes consist of black suits, white dress shirts, and black ties. They all wear black fedora hats and carry Tommy guns.

1. Welcome to the Airfield	
The queue line begins in a vintage airplane hangar, complete with biplanes and triplanes, aircraft parts, and tools, immersing riders in the world of the Rocketeer as they go on their first stunt pilot mission. 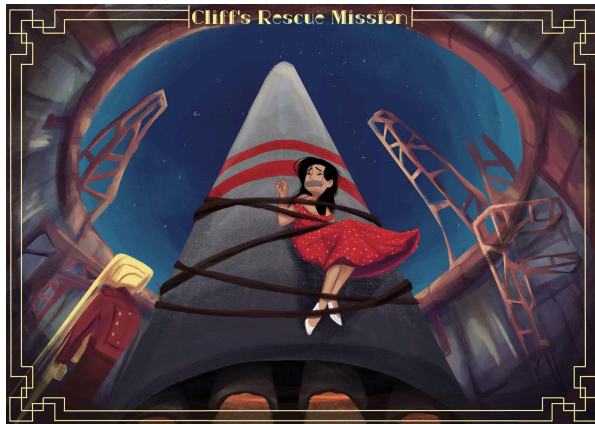

Previous Notes

- When the ride is in action, it isn't necessary to show the track all the time.
 - S&S ride vehicle, the center part can turn in any direction, but the cars stay relatively parallel to the ground.
1. Load: inside hangar
 2. We run along the runway for a moment, picking up speed.
 3. We launch into the air.
 4. We dip down and fly up to the sky.
 5. We flip over, upside down, and soar over the top of a building.
 6. Flying, we follow a street above.
 7. We slow down and enter an office building.
 - a. RV turns on its side, and the two cars are in different rooms, one above the other.
 8. Inside we find a typical office, but with lots of mobster loot.
 9. Animatronic mobsters find us and run from the building.
 10. We meet them on the street, and there is a car chase between us and two black mob cars through city streets. (this can be several cells)
 - a. Potentially they could be shooting at us. In the storyboard, Mobsters can have massive drum-fed guns, but they aren't pointing them at the guests.
 11. We speed off and arrive at the airport ahead of the Mob
 12. We find Jenny in a hangar strapped to a rocket.
 - a. In the recent comics, Jenny Blake looks just like Katy Perry.
 13. The countdown shows that she is about to launch. The mobster says that we have arrived too late.
 14. Rocket Launches, and we follow it up into the sky.
 15. We return to the city and land on a roof where we see The Rocketeer hovering holding Jenny.
