Court of Appeals

How to vote an IRV Contest

The last section of your ballot asks you to select a Court of Appeals Judge by Instant Runoff Voting. To vote in this contest(s), select as your first choice the candidate you most want to win. Then for your second or third choices, mark the candidates you would like to win if your first choice does not.

How the IRV Contest will be Counted

The first choice votes will be tallied to determine if a candidate receives a majority of votes. If not, then the two candidates with the most first choice votes advance to an Instant Runoff round, where the second or third choice votes for these candidates are tabulated and then added to the first choice totals from the first round. The candidate with the most combined votes from both rounds wins the election.

Court of Appeals and Superior Court Judge

How to vote an IRV Contest

The last section of your ballot asks you to select a Court of Appeals Judge [and a Superior Court Judge] by Instant Runoff Voting. To vote in this contest(s), select as your first choice the candidate you most want to win. Then for your second or third choices, mark the candidates you would like to win if your first choice does not.

How the IRV Contest will be Counted

The first choice votes will be tallied to determine if a candidate receives a majority of votes. If not, then the two candidates with the most first choice votes advance to an Instant Runoff round, where the second or third choice votes for these candidates are tabulated and then added to the first choice totals from the first round.
