Tell me about the land.

You could tell about the land by describing where the country is in relation to other countries. You could describe how much land there is. You could describe some of the interesting geological features of this land. We want to know what we might experience if we were to live on this particular land. You might also want to tell about the plants and animals that live in this place.

Tell me about the people.

how they are the same or different than people from where you live. You could talk about unique things about specific groups of people that live on this land. What would it be like to hang out with the people here?

Tell me about the relationships of power
