WHAT MASKS DO I WEAR IN MY DAILY LIFE?

You are an artist who has been given an opportunity to share your artwork at a major multicultural museum in a special exhibit. The museum has asked you to create a mask that displays your culture, personal background, and interests as a unique person and artist. They have left the creative style up to you. Use your knowledge of YOU to design your mask.

PROJECT SUMMARY

This quarter learners will embark on a self-reflection journey to answer the course driving question of "What masks do I wear in my daily life?". Learners will artistically create a mask, craft an artist statement, build a museum exhibit, and present their mask through a video presentation in this adventure.

Through their courses 7th graders will explore various medieval world cultures as well as look at diversity and how DNA and genes influence what we look like on the outside. Learners will ask themselves, "How does my DNA and history influence the "mask" I wear today?"
