YCUSD Early College Program FAQs for 2025-26

- Q. If I am accepted into the Early College program for my freshman year of high school, do I have to apply to be in the
 - program every year?
 - A. No. Once you are in, you are in the program for the four years of high school.
- 2. **Q**. Is there a college tuition for Early College courses?
 - A. No. There is no tuition for high school students who take less than 11.5 units in Fall or Spring semester and less than 8.5 units in the summer.
- 3. **Q.** Is there a cost for books needed for Early College courses?
 - A. No. All required Early College course textbooks are purchased by Yuba City Unified School District.
- 4. **Q**. How will Early College students get their college course textbooks?
 - A. Early College students will check out required textbooks at their respective high school library.
- 5. Q. Are the college instructors, who teach Early College students, employees of Yuba City Unified School District?
 - A. No. The college instructors who teach Early College students are employees of Yuba College. Completely independent of Yuba City Unified School District.

- 6. Q. What is "study hall"?
 - A. Since there are no college classes on Wednesdays and students do not have high school class during period 1 (and 2 for YCHS), 9th graders have to go to period 1 study hall.
- 7. **Q**. Can Early College freshman get a study Hall Exemption?
 - A. Early College 9th graders are not eligible to submit a study hall exemption for the fall semester. However, Early College 9th graders are eligible to submit a study hall exemption for the spring semester.
- 8. Q. What are the criteria for a study hall exemption?
 - A. Grade of "C", **not "C-"**, or better in all of your high school and college classes combined. No more than 1 C for all high school and college classes combined.
- 9. **Q**. Can I choose to withdrawal from the Early College program?
 - A. Yes. Students withdrawal from the Early College program for various reasons (i.e. early high school graduation; poor college grades; courses do not fit the career interest).
- Q. If I withdraw from the Early College Program before the end of my senior year, will I still participate in the Early

College recognition events and receive the Early College graduation stole?

- A. No. The Early College Program recognition events and the graduation stole is awarded to students who complete the Early College Program through the end of their senior (12th grade) year.
- 11. **Q**. Who do I call when my son/daughter is going to be absent to a college course?
 - A. No one. Only students can contact college professors. It is a good practice for students to email their professors about an future absences or absences due to illness. But, parents do need to call the high school.
- 12. **Q**. Can I take summer college courses?
 - A. Yes, as long as the college courses are not courses that are part of the Early College 4-year plan.

 Summer courses will require approval from the Dual Enrollment Coordinator.
- 13. **Q**. Can I take additional college courses during the fall or spring semester?
 - A. Yes. Early College students can take additional courses in Fall or Spring semesters. Additional courses will require approval from the Dual Enrollment Coordinator.
- 14. **Q**. Are my college grades weighted like AP and Honors courses?
 - A. Yes. College grades are weighted like AP and Honors courses.

- 15. **Q**. Will the college courses give me high school credit toward high school graduation.
 - A. Yes. All college courses will be posted on your high school transcript.
- 16. **Q**. Will I only have one transcript to send to a university when I apply to a 4-year university?
 - A. No. You will have two transcripts. You will have a high school transcript, which will also include your college courses and you will have a college transcript which will only have your college courses. You will need to send both transcripts to the university you will be attending after high school.
- 17. **Q**. If I go to YCHS, can I take a pre-period and then go to my college course?
 - A. Not advisable. More than likely, you will be late to your college class every day.
- 18. **Q**. Are there any other limitations to being in the program?
 - A. Yes. There may be some high school elective courses you may not be able to take because the high school elective is offered during your Early College course.
- 19. **Q**. How do I register for college courses?
 - A. Students have to submit an online college application to be admitted to Yuba College. The Dual Enrollment Coordinator will enroll Early College students into their college courses.

- 20. **Q**. If I do not get into the Early College Program, can I still take college classes?
 - A. Absolutely. Many students take college courses on their own in the summer and during the school year.
