Important Announcement from the State of California Re: Savings Program for College or Career: The California Kids Investment and Development Savings Program (CalKIDS)

CalKIDS gives children in California a jump start on saving for college or career training.

To be eligible for CalKIDS, participants must be born in California on or after July 1, 2022 or an eligible low-income public school

student in grades 1-12 in California. All participants receive a seed deposit in a CalKIDS account to help pay for future education after high school.





- Allow 24 hrs for your account to be approved by GENIUS. Your password will be provided via email to log in to your fair account.
- You need to log into the fair account to approve or deny student projects as they register. You will receive a notification email when a student registers their projects by selecting your fair.




