Please know that we are looking for **outstanding pieces of art that are each student's own original, unique interpretation of our 2025 conference theme, not a replication or variation of our conference logo as seen above.

We hope you consider sharing your extraordinary artistic gifts with us and submit *your* vision of *Empowering Change*.

Please read thoroughly and turn in all required items with your submitted piece.

CAGT Student Art Contest: Application and Guidelines

TEACHERS, STUDENTS and PARENTS/GUARDIANS PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION BEFORE SUBMITTING ARTWORK

Eligibility: Any student enrolled in a K-12 Colorado school or homeschooled is eligible to participate.

Student Level: Select your le	evel based on the 2025-2026 s	chool year. Select only one:
Elementary (K-2) Middle School (6-8)	Upper Elementary (3-5) High School (9-12)	

Guidelines:

- Art **MUST** be an original, creative interpretation of the theme: *Empowering Change*. *Note: We want **your own personal vision** of the theme, NOT a depiction of the conference's logo.
- Each student can submit *only* one piece of art. One picture per piece needs to be sent as an image or pdf.
- Artwork must be the student's original concept, not a copy of anyone else's copyrighted material, and the student must be the creator of the art. The student is solely responsible for any infringement on copyrighted materials.
- If the project is done in class, the project must be an original, creative
 interpretation of the theme, not every student creating a slight variation of the
 same product. This should also not be done for a different project and made to
 try to fit our conference theme. Additionally, if this is a class project, only 1 or 2
 of the best depictions of the theme PER GRADE LEVEL may be submitted to the
 CAGT Art Contest.
- Art can be 2D or 3D. 2D pieces must have dimensions no larger than 24 inches x 36 inches and must be matted (See example at the bottom of the document).
 Framing is allowed, but not necessary. 3D pieces must have dimensions no larger than 24 inches x 24 inches x 24 inches.
- A copy of the student information (Art Tag is provided) must be printed, filled out and sent in along with the picture of the artwork. **DO NOT** glue or tape it to the piece. Students **MUST** express how their piece relates to the theme.

- Accepted art will be displayed in the Google survey in the appropriate division, where attendees will be able to vote on their favorites using the provided QR code.
- A 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finisher in each division will be determined by the votes
 of the conference attendees. Only the 1st place winner from each group
 (elementary, upper elementary, middle school, or high school) will be awarded a
 \$50 gift card.

**Again, please submit only artwork that is extraordinary for the student's age, and the piece MUST relate to the conference theme.

**CAGT reserves the right to not display a piece of art for any reason, including inappropriate content and/or language.

**You will be notified if your submitted artwork has been selected no later than Friday, October 3, 2025. If your piece has been accepted, information will be sent on next steps to get your artwork to the Embassy Suites. If selected, please fill out the tag below and send it with your piece to be displayed with the artwork. *Do NOT change nor resize the tag in any way.* Do not adhere the tag to the piece as our staff will take care of that.

ATTENTION: Due to limited space at the Embassy Suites, John Q. Hammons Convention Center, allocated for the Art Contest, we are requiring students to submit a photograph of their art piece to CAGT with the required paperwork (see below) no later than Monday, September 15th. The Conference Committee will review all completed submissions and select the final pieces that will be displayed at the CAGT Conference. All artists will be notified by Friday, October 3th, if their piece has been chosen or not. Accepted artists are responsible for the drop-off and pick-up of their artwork at the conference. They will receive an email with next steps about the options on how to do this and other contest logistics.
