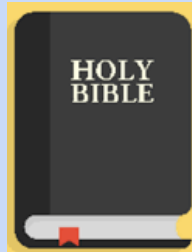

The Torah (Law): (The Five Books of Moses)

Book of Genesis

Creation, the beginning of mankind, and stories of the patriarchs and matriarchs.

Book of Exodus

The Israelites' enslavement in Egypt, miraculous redemption, the giving of the Torah, and building of the Mishkan (Tabernacle).

Book of Leviticus

Laws of sacrificial worship in the Mishkan (Tabernacle), ritual purity, and other topics like agriculture, ethics, and holy days.

Book of Numbers

Wanderings of the Israelites in the desert, census, rebellion, spies and war, interspersed with laws.

Book of Deuteronomy

Moses' final speeches, recalling events of the desert, reviewing old laws, introducing new ones, and calling for faithfulness to God.

The Nevi'im (Prophets):

Book of Joshua

The Israelites enter, conquer, and settle Israel under the leadership of Joshua.

Book of Judges

Cycles of sin, foreign oppression, repentance, and redemption through leaders appointed by God.

Book of 1st Samuel

The prophet Samuel, the advent of monarchy with the reign of Saul, and the rise of a young David.

Book of 2nd Samuel

King David's triumphs and challenges as he establishes a united kingdom with Jerusalem as its capital.

Book of 1st Kings

Solomon's kingship, construction of the Temple, a schism in the kingdom, and Elijah the Prophet.

Book of 2nd Kings

Stories and miracles of the prophet Elisha, the decline of Israel's kingdoms, and the Temple's destruction.

Book of Isaiah

Criticism of religious corruption, calls for change, and descriptions of a utopian future.

Book of Jeremiah

Warnings of Jerusalem's destruction and demands for repentance, largely rejected by the people, some of whom torture and persecute him.

Book of Ezekiel

Dramatic symbolism conveying rebuke or hope, and visions of a future Temple.

Book of Hosea

Rebuke of Israel for abandoning God, comparing their relationship to that of unfaithful lovers.

Book of Joel

A locust plague, a call to repent, and a promise of judgement for Israel's oppressors.

Book of Amos

Condemnation of oppression and arrogance in the nations and Israel, and a call for reform.

Book of Obadiah

The shortest book in Tanakh, at just 21 verses, predicting the downfall of the kingdom of Edom.

Book of Jonah

A great fish swallows Jonah when he tries to escape his mission of prophecy, and Jonah repents.

Book of Micah

Berating of Israel and its leadership for insincere ritual worship, and calls for justice and kindness.

Book of Nahum

A celebratory prophecy about the downfall of the Assyrian empire, an oppressor of Israel.

Book of Habakkuk

Charging God to explain the unjust success of the Babylonians, God's response, and a prayer.

Book of Zephaniah

Warnings of the destruction God will wreck on the unfaithful and calls for justice and humility.

Book of Haggai

Urgent calls to build the Second Temple and descriptions of its future glory.

Book of Zechariah

Symbolic visions of redemption, explained by angels, and descriptions of the end of days.

Book of Malachi

Criticism of disingenuous ritual worship and descriptions of God's future blessings.

The Ketuvim (Writings):

Book of Psalms Book 1; Book 2; Book 3; Book 4; Book 5;

Poems of despair, hope, gratitude, and supplication to God, attributed to David and others.

Book of Proverbs

Guidance for living a wise, moral, and righteous life, in the form of poems and short statements.

Book of Job

Satan convinces God to strike a righteous man with tragedy, spurring conversations about suffering.

Book of the Song of Songs

Poetic conversations of two lovers, traditionally read as a metaphor for God and Israel.

Book of Ruth

A Moabite widow remains loyal to her mother-in-law and to Israel, embarking on a new beginning.

Book of Lamentations

Laments of Jerusalem's destruction, grappling with theological explanations.

Book of Ecclesiastes

An exploration of the meaning of life, reckoning with death, futility, and purpose.

Book of Esther

Esther becomes queen of Persia and foils a plot to destroy the Jews, establishing the Purim holiday.

Book of Daniel

A Jewish advisor to Babylonian kings interprets dreams and miraculously escapes danger.

Book of Ezra

Rebuilding the Temple after decades of exile and religious revival led by Ezra the scribe.

Book of Nehemiah

Rebuilding Jerusalem's walls and the nation's commitment to observe the commandments.

Book of 1st Chronicles

Recounts of events in the Torah and early Prophets, focusing on King David.

Book of 2nd Chronicles

Recounts of events in the Prophets, from Solomon through the First Temple's destruction.

The Apocrypha (Secretly From the Bible):

Book of 1 Esdras

And Josias held the feast of the passover in Jerusalem unto his Lord, and offered the passover the fourteenth day of the first month;...

Book of 2 Esdras

The second book of the prophet Esdras, the son of Sarais, the son of Azarias, the son of Helchias, the son of Sadamias, the son of Sadoc, the son of Architob,...

Book of Tobit

The book of the words of Tobit, son of Tobiel, the son of Ananiel, the son of Aduel, the son of Gabael, of the seed of Asael, of the tribe of Nephthali;...

Book of Judith

In the twelfth year of the reign of Nabuchodonosor, who reigned in Nineve, the great city; in the days of Arphaxad, which reigned over the Medes in Ecbatane,...

Book of Baruch

And these are the words of the book, which Baruch the son of Nerias, the son of Maasias, the son of Sedecias, the son of Asadias, the son of Chelcias, wrote in Babylon,...

Book of Susanna

There dwelt a man in Babylon, called Joacim:

And he took a wife, whose name was Susanna, the daughter of Chelcias, a very fair woman, and one that feared the Lord....

Additions to the Book of Esther

Then Mardocheus said, God hath done these things.

For I remember a dream which I saw concerning these matters, and nothing thereof hath failed....

Book of the Wisdom of Solomon

Love righteousness, ye that be judges of the earth: think of the Lord with a good (heart,) and in simplicity of heart seek him.

For he will be found of them that tempt him not; and sheweth himself unto such as do not distrust him....

Book of the Wisdom of Jesus Son of Sirach

All wisdom cometh from the Lord, and is with him for ever.

Who can number the sand of the sea, and the drops of rain, and the days of eternity?...

The Letter of Jeremiah

A copy of an epistle, which Jeremy sent unto them which were to be led captives into Babylon by the king of the Babylonians, to certify them, as it was commanded him of God....

The Prayer of Azariah

And they walked in the midst of the fire, praising God, and blessing the Lord.

Then Azarias stood up, and prayed on this manner; and opening his mouth in the midst of the fire said,...

The Prayer of Manasseh

O Lord, Almighty God of our fathers, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and of their righteous seed; who hast made heaven and earth, with all the ornament thereof;...

Book of Bel and the Dragon

And king Astyages was gathered to his fathers, and Cyrus of Persia received his kingdom. And Daniel conversed with the king, and was honoured above all his friends.

Book of 1 Maccabees

And it happened, after that Alexander son of Philip, the Macedonian, who came out of the land of Chettiim, had smitten Darius king of the Persians and Medes, that he reigned in his stead, the first over Greece,

And made many wars, and won many strong holds, and slew the kings of the earth,

Book of 2 Maccabees

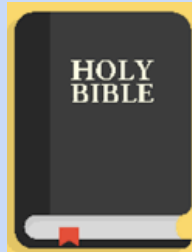
The brethren, the Jews that be at Jerusalem and in the land of Judea, wish unto the brethren, the Jews that are throughout Egypt health and peace:

The Gospels:

[Book of Matthew](#)

Written in 80-85 CE. Author: anonymous; traditionally ascribed to Matthew, the tax collector disciple of Jesus.

An account of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection that stresses he is the Jewish messiah sent from the Jewish God to the Jewish people in fulfillment of the prophecies of the Jewish Scriptures.

[Book of Mark](#)

Written in 70 CE. Author: anonymous; traditionally ascribed to Mark, the personal secretary of the apostle Peter.

The earliest record of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, which portrays him as the messiah no one expected or understood, who was sent to die for the sins of the world and be raised from the dead.

[Book of Luke](#)

Written in 80-85 CE. Author: anonymous; traditionally ascribed to Luke, a traveling companion of Paul.

An account of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection that stresses he was the final prophet sent from God, destined to be rejected by his own people so salvation would go to gentiles.

Book of John

Written in 90-95 CE. Author: anonymous; traditional ascribed to Jesus' disciple John the Son of Zebedee.

An account of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection focusing on his identity as a pre-existent divine being sent from above to bring eternal life to all who believe in him

The Acts of the Apostles:

Book of Acts

Written in 85-90 CE. Author: anonymous: same author as Gospel of Luke.

An account of the miraculous spread of the Christian church after Jesus' resurrection, through the preaching and miracles of the apostles, especially Paul, who took the message to gentiles.

The Epistles

Book of Romans

Written 60-64 CE. Author: Paul.

Written to the Christian church of Rome to explain the essentials of Paul's gospel message, that only the death of Jesus can bring salvation from sin, for both Jews and gentiles.

Book of 1st Corinthians

Written: mid 50s CE. Author: Paul.

Written to the church in Corinth, in response to numerous problems experienced after Paul's departure, including divisions in the church, sexual immorality, proper worship, and the reality of the future resurrection.

Book of 2nd Corinthians

Written: mid 50s CE. Author: Paul.

Follow-up letter to 1 Corinthians, which attacks "super-apostles" who claim precedence over Paul and explains that followers of Jesus in this age will experience hardship rather than glory.

Book of Galatians

Written: late 50s CE. Author: Paul.

Written with urgency to gentile churches throughout region of Galatia to attack those arguing that gentile Christians must adopt the ways of Judaism, especially circumcision.

Book of Ephesians

Written: end of first century. Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

Letter to church of Ephesus, giving a plea for the unity provided by Christ and the free salvation he provides, to a church experiencing splits between Jewish and gentile factions.

Book of Philippians

Written: late 50s CE. Author: Paul.

Joyful letter thanking the church in Philippi for its moral and material support and urging church unity among members who should live for others in imitation of Christ.

Book of Colossians

Written: end of first century. Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

Letter urging Christians in Colossae not to worship spiritual powers other than Christ, who alone provides all that is needed for salvation and spiritual completion.

Book of 1st Thessalonians

Written: 49-50 CE. Author: Paul.

Paul's earliest letter. A joyful recollection of his time with the church, stressing the imminent arrival of Christ from heaven and the salvation he will then bring, even to believers who had already died.

Book of 2nd Thessalonians

Written: ca 70s CE? Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

Written in imitation of 1 Thessalonians, an appeal to Christians not to think the return of Christ is immediate. The end is coming, but it will be preceded by clear signs.

Book of 1st Timothy

Written: end of first century. Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

Allegedly written to Paul's young follower Timothy, pastor of church in Ephesus, giving instructions about how to organize and run his church.

Book of 2nd Timothy

Written: end of first century. Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

By the same author as 1 Timothy and Titus, also addressed to Timothy, giving Paul's final thoughts and instructions as he is preparing soon to die.

Book of Titus

Written: end of first century. Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

By the same author as 1 and 2 Timothy. Addressed to Paul's follower Titus, pastor of church on Cyprus, giving instructions about how to organize and run his church.

Book of Philemon

Written: late 50s CE. Author: Paul.

Letter written to a wealthy Christian, Philemon, urging him to receive back and forgive his slave Onesimus, who had absconded with his property and fled to Paul for help.

Book of Hebrews

Written: end of first century. Author: Anonymous; traditionally ascribed to Paul.

A plea to readers not to leave the Christian faith for Judaism, since Christ is superior to everything in the Hebrew Bible, which foreshadowed the salvation he would bring.

Book of James

Written: end of first century. Author unknown, in the name of Jesus' brother James.

A moral essay correcting Christians who believed that "faith alone" would save, by stressing the need to do "good works," since faith without works "is dead."

Book of 1st Peter

Written: end of first century. Author unknown: in the name of Jesus' disciple Peter.

A letter encouraging Christians experiencing suffering for their faith, emphasizing that Christ himself suffered, as would all those who strive to be his witnesses in the world.

Book of 2nd Peter

Written: ca. 120 CE. Author unknown: in the name of Jesus' disciple Peter.

A letter explaining why the “imminent” return of Jesus had not yet happened, assuring its readers that a delay was necessary but all was going according to God’ plan.

Book of 1st John

Written: end of first century. Author: anonymous; traditionally ascribed to to Jesus’ disciple John the Son of Zebedee.

An essay written to urge followers of Jesus to be fulling loving to one another and not to be led astray by a separatist faction that suggested Jesus was a phantasmal being and not fully human.

Book of 2nd John

Written: end of first century. Author anonymous; same author as 1 John; traditionally ascribed to Jesus’ disciple John the Son of Zebedee.

Brief letter addressing a church leader’s community urging unity in love and the avoidance of false teaching.

Book of 3rd John

Written: end of first century. Author anonymous; same author as 1 John; traditionally ascribed to Jesus’ disciple John the Son of Zebedee.

Very brief letter addressing similar issues of 2 John in light of a specific problem, the reception of a visiting church leader who was rejected by some in the congregation.

Book of Jude

Written: end of first century. Author anonymous; in the name of Jude, the brother of Jesus.

Brief and vitriolic letter attacking false teachers who had infiltrated the Christian community, without indicating the nature of their teaching.

Book of Revelation

Written 90-95 CE. Author: an unknown John; traditionally ascribed to Jesus’ disciple, John the Son of Zebedee.

A description of mysterious visions of the heavenly realm and the cataclysmic disasters to strike the earth before all God’s enemies are destroyed and a new utopian world arrives for the followers of Christ.

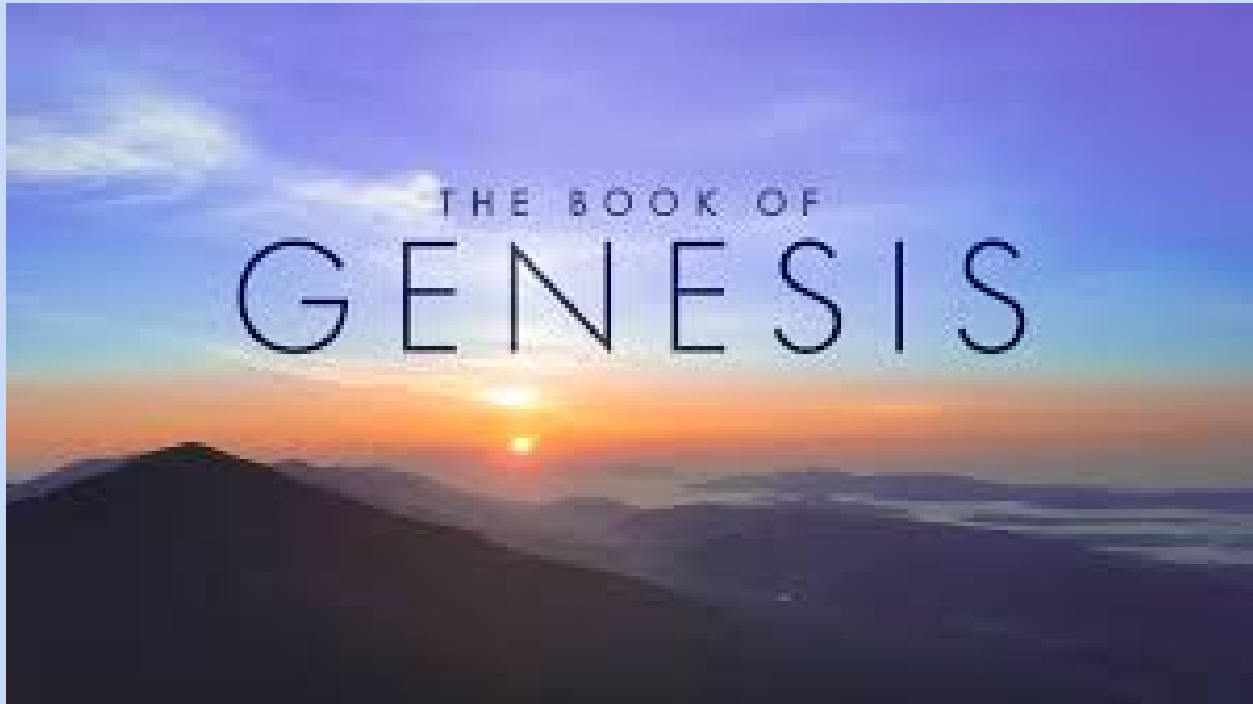

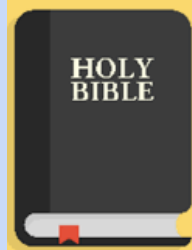

The Gospels:

[Book of Matthew](#)

Written in 80-85 CE. Author: anonymous; traditionally ascribed to Matthew, the tax collector disciple of Jesus.

An account of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection that stresses he is the Jewish messiah sent from the Jewish God to the Jewish people in fulfillment of the prophecies of the Jewish Scriptures.

[Book of Mark](#)

Written in 70 CE. Author: anonymous; traditionally ascribed to Mark, the personal secretary of the apostle Peter.

The earliest record of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, which portrays him as the messiah no one expected or understood, who was sent to die for the sins of the world and be raised from the dead.

[Book of Luke](#)

Written in 80-85 CE. Author: anonymous; traditionally ascribed to Luke, a traveling companion of Paul.

An account of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection that stresses he was the final prophet sent from God, destined to be rejected by his own people so salvation would go to gentiles.

Book of John

Written in 90-95 CE. Author: anonymous; traditional ascribed to Jesus' disciple John the Son of Zebedee.

An account of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection focusing on his identity as a pre-existent divine being sent from above to bring eternal life to all who believe in him

The Acts of the Apostles:

Book of Acts

Written in 85-90 CE. Author: anonymous: same author as Gospel of Luke.

An account of the miraculous spread of the Christian church after Jesus' resurrection, through the preaching and miracles of the apostles, especially Paul, who took the message to gentiles.

The Epistles

Book of Romans

Written 60-64 CE. Author: Paul.

Written to the Christian church of Rome to explain the essentials of Paul's gospel message, that only the death of Jesus can bring salvation from sin, for both Jews and gentiles.

Book of 1st Corinthians

Written: mid 50s CE. Author: Paul.

Written to the church in Corinth, in response to numerous problems experienced after Paul's departure, including divisions in the church, sexual immorality, proper worship, and the reality of the future resurrection.

Book of 2nd Corinthians

Written: mid 50s CE. Author: Paul.

Follow-up letter to 1 Corinthians, which attacks "super-apostles" who claim precedence over Paul and explains that followers of Jesus in this age will experience hardship rather than glory.

Book of Galatians

Written: late 50s CE. Author: Paul.

Written with urgency to gentile churches throughout region of Galatia to attack those arguing that gentile Christians must adopt the ways of Judaism, especially circumcision.

Book of Ephesians

Written: end of first century. Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

Letter to church of Ephesus, giving a plea for the unity provided by Christ and the free salvation he provides, to a church experiencing splits between Jewish and gentile factions.

Book of Philippians

Written: late 50s CE. Author: Paul.

Joyful letter thanking the church in Philippi for its moral and material support and urging church unity among members who should live for others in imitation of Christ.

Book of Colossians

Written: end of first century. Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

Letter urging Christians in Colossae not to worship spiritual powers other than Christ, who alone provides all that is needed for salvation and spiritual completion.

Book of 1st Thessalonians

Written: 49-50 CE. Author: Paul.

Paul's earliest letter. A joyful recollection of his time with the church, stressing the imminent arrival of Christ from heaven and the salvation he will then bring, even to believers who had already died.

Book of 2nd Thessalonians

Written: ca 70s CE? Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

Written in imitation of 1 Thessalonians, an appeal to Christians not to think the return of Christ is immediate. The end is coming, but it will be preceded by clear signs.

Book of 1st Timothy

Written: end of first century. Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

Allegedly written to Paul's young follower Timothy, pastor of church in Ephesus, giving instructions about how to organize and run his church.

Book of 2nd Timothy

Written: end of first century. Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

By the same author as 1 Timothy and Titus, also addressed to Timothy, giving Paul's final thoughts and instructions as he is preparing soon to die.

Book of Titus

Written: end of first century. Author: unknown, in the name of Paul.

By the same author as 1 and 2 Timothy. Addressed to Paul's follower Titus, pastor of church on Cyprus, giving instructions about how to organize and run his church.

Book of Philemon

Written: late 50s CE. Author: Paul.

Letter written to a wealthy Christian, Philemon, urging him to receive back and forgive his slave Onesimus, who had absconded with his property and fled to Paul for help.

Book of Hebrews

Written: end of first century. Author: Anonymous; traditionally ascribed to Paul.

A plea to readers not to leave the Christian faith for Judaism, since Christ is superior to everything in the Hebrew Bible, which foreshadowed the salvation he would bring.

Book of James

Written: end of first century. Author unknown, in the name of Jesus' brother James.

A moral essay correcting Christians who believed that "faith alone" would save, by stressing the need to do "good works," since faith without works "is dead."

Book of 1st Peter

Written: end of first century. Author unknown: in the name of Jesus' disciple Peter.

A letter encouraging Christians experiencing suffering for their faith, emphasizing that Christ himself suffered, as would all those who strive to be his witnesses in the world.

Book of 2nd Peter

Written: ca. 120 CE. Author unknown: in the name of Jesus' disciple Peter.

A letter explaining why the “imminent” return of Jesus had not yet happened, assuring its readers that a delay was necessary but all was going according to God’ plan.

Book of 1st John

Written: end of first century. Author: anonymous; traditionally ascribed to to Jesus’ disciple John the Son of Zebedee.

An essay written to urge followers of Jesus to be fulling loving to one another and not to be led astray by a separatist faction that suggested Jesus was a phantasmal being and not fully human.

Book of 2nd John

Written: end of first century. Author anonymous; same author as 1 John; traditionally ascribed to Jesus’ disciple John the Son of Zebedee.

Brief letter addressing a church leader’s community urging unity in love and the avoidance of false teaching.

Book of 3rd John

Written: end of first century. Author anonymous; same author as 1 John; traditionally ascribed to Jesus’ disciple John the Son of Zebedee.

Very brief letter addressing similar issues of 2 John in light of a specific problem, the reception of a visiting church leader who was rejected by some in the congregation.

Book of Jude

Written: end of first century. Author anonymous; in the name of Jude, the brother of Jesus.

Brief and vitriolic letter attacking false teachers who had infiltrated the Christian community, without indicating the nature of their teaching.

Book of Revelation

Written 90-95 CE. Author: an unknown John; traditionally ascribed to Jesus’ disciple, John the Son of Zebedee.

A description of mysterious visions of the heavenly realm and the cataclysmic disasters to strike the earth before all God’s enemies are destroyed and a new utopian world arrives for the followers of Christ.
