The Celebration of Baptism (Family comes forward)

L: The Lord be with you

Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here cleansed from sin and born again, may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. The Baptismal Covenant

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The Baptism (Please be seated)

Each person is presented by name to the celebrant, who then pours water upon the candidates, saying.

L: Colten Ray I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**.

The celebrant makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each one saying to each,

L: I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The celebrant, in the full sight of the congregation, prays over the newly baptized, saying,

L: Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen**

The Giving of the Light - To the newly baptized a lighted candle is given

L: Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

A: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

L: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

A: We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The Rector's Corner - "You might want to read it"

A Spiritual House

You also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ (1 Peter 2:5.)

In chapter 2 of the first letter of Peter, he describes the church as a collection of living stones, not left lying around in a pile, but built into a spiritual house. If your arrived at our church building (St Timothy's), and found a gaping hole in one wall and a heap of bricks under it, you will not only know that the stones were in the wrong place, but also that the building had been weakened by their absence. As Christians, we are not to be like stones lying around, but stones built into one another, and committed to one another. Otherwise, we will be useless and cause others to be less effective than they could be.

The unity of this spiritual building (our Christian Family) is vitally important. Partisanship (Politics) or some other spirit can destroy it. Paul rebukes division in the church, and issues a stern warning about those who destroy God's temple (1 Corinthians 3:16). In the letters to the 7 churches, (Revelation 2 and 3), God said by his Spirit that unless relationships were sorted out within the churches, He would remove the very light of Christ from their midst.

Home groups, when governed by discretion and confidentiality, can have a very important part to play in the matter of relationships and spiritual health and growth. Home groups must be small. Sociologists have found that 12 is the ideal optimum number in a group. In a group larger than 12, people can hide behind others, be uncommitted, or more importantly, get hurt without it being noticed. Members of small home groups must be real with one another, whether this brings conflict and pain or not. In a sample of churches, when people were asked what they most needed from a small home group, the majority of those who replied said that they wanted a place where they could be honest about themselves without fear of rejection. Small-group meetings do not have to meet in people's homes. Church facilities too are great alternatives. This is food for thought.

<u>Prayer</u>: Father, whatever our church building looks like, make your people inside it into a truly spiritual house that is fit for you to live in. Amen!


