Example:

The wind is angry. (5 syllables)
It won't let me play outside. (7 syllables)
Please just go away! (5 syllables)

Don't forget to publish your poem!

*To publish means to revise and edit, making sure you have correct spelling, punctuation, and NEAT handwriting. When we have our published poetry, we also usually draw illustrations to accompany the words you've authored.

Instructional Note:

A Haiku is a poem about nature (anything in nature!) that follows a specific pattern.

- 3 lined poem
 - o First line has 5 syllables
 - Second line has 7 syllables
 - Third line has 5 syllables
- Does not have to rhyme
- DOES have to be about nature
- It helps to count out the syllables on your hand while you think aloud before you write them down
