Johnston Middle & High School are honored to partner with DMACC to provide online college classes for Johnston students in grades 9-12 who wish to extend their learning by participating in the DMACC Career Online Academy. These college classes are offered Fall and Spring semesters only, not summers.

Students may review the following online course offerings and schedule a time with their JHS counselors, starting April 9th to register for Fall 2025 online classes. At JMS - please work with Mrs. Fitzgerald - counselor, as she is handling all DMACC registrations.

The last day to sign up for Fall 2025 DMACC classes is May 29 at 3:00 PM. Classes do fill up quickly, so we recommend you register sooner than later. It is first come, first available.

FAQ & Helpful Hints to be Successful in DMACC Career Online Academy

- If planning to attend a college other than DMACC after high school graduation, it is the student's responsibility to research coursework with that future institution early in the process to maximize credit transferability.
- DMACC grades will be your first college grades on your college transcripts - choose wisely and plan to dedicate appropriate study time towards your DMACC classes to be successful.
- Students should be aware that any failing grade issued by DMACC will be part of their college transcript and will jeopardize their overall college GPA
- Any failing grade from a DMACC online course listed on a JCSD transcript is subject to JCSD eligibility guidelines for sports and activities, just like JHS classes.
- Courses below marked with an asterisk * also meet the criteria to transfer as a core course at all 3 Regent Universities (Iowa, ISU, and UNI).
- If a course does not have an *, it could still transfer to a regent or other institution but wasn't identified at all 3 collectively.
- Class length varies in length and students need to pay attention to length of course. DMACC also doesn't always follow Johnston's academic schedule, be aware and be informed.
- If a course has a # - we recommend you complete the JHS course listed prior to DMACC class to ensure success and build foundational knowledge, it is not required.
- Students will earn the specific DMACC credit and JCSD elective credit on their HS transcript.
- Always read DMACC course descriptions carefully to see if any prerequisites exist. [DMACC Online Course Descriptions](#)
- If classes are not listed on JHS/JMS AA Degree tracker, they will count for an elective credit towards AA Degree.
- Online courses expect you to check email frequently, work on assignments regularly and complete assignments promptly. Online courses require a great deal of independent work and students must set time aside on a regular basis. Checking assignments online weekly is an expectation, so you don't fall behind.
- Please schedule an appointment with your counselor to sign up as soon as possible. Our helpful counseling team is here to help you plan and prepare for your future. **DEADLINE to sign up is May 29 at 3:00 PM - no exceptions.**
