Answers:

- 1. AAMC defines physician advocacy as "Action by a physician to promote those social, economic, educational, and political changes that ameliorate the suffering and threats to human health and well-being that he or she identifies through his or her professional work and expertise."

- 3. A person who speaks on behalf of another person or group
- 4. A principle, recommendation, or course of action proposed by a governing body, party, or institution
- 5. Individual/patient, Institutional, Governmental, Personal
