1. If I (be) tired tonight, I (go) to bed early.

If I am tired tonight, I will go to bed early.

2. If I (have) a million dollars, I (be able to) buy any car in the world.

3. She (not be) sick today if she (take) better care of herself.

4. If I (be) a nutritionist and not a teacher, I (be able to) help you design a special diet.

5. I (not work) so much if I (not need) the money. (*Said by someone who works a lot.*)

6. I (get) a good job in my country if I really (learn) English well.



7. We (not be late) if we (leave) early tomorrow morning.

8. I (not be able to) watch TV shows and read newspapers from my country if I (not have) Internet access.

9. For your date tonight, I think you should buy her some flowers. She (love) it if you (bring) her a present like flowers.

10. My car doesn't have much gas left. If I (not buy) some soon, the car (stop) working.

11. If I (have) a work visa for this country, I (have) more money to spend than I do now.

12. I (not be) here if I (not want) to learn English.

6. (If) You have to eat out tomorrow.

7. (If) You didn't take a shower this morning or last night.

8. (If) Your country doesn't have restaurants.

9. (If) You don't have the Internet at home this evening.

10. (If) You never started learning English.

11. (If) You didn't come to North America to study English.

13. (If) You drank an energy drink last night before bed.
