Arlington Tree Committee - They expanded their mandates, gotten more active in town, concerning the discussions around the MBTA zoning requirements, where arlington is required o zone 2046 multifamily units, a divide in development from people who want the housing and people who are environmentalist, they've dived right into the conversation, attending meetings and talking to the planning dept, that trees and housing can both be done. Trees are not expendable.

Boston Parks Dept, 7 year draft of open space land, comments open until may 21st, important piece of strategy, it's a year overdue. Boston Parks Department website to make comments, please weigh in.

Louise Johnson

The trees, the city and DCR plants, notices that most of the gators (watering bags) are left empty, all along VFW parkway (100 or more) they are all empty. Q: Louise wants to know how we find out what the plans are for watering? Is there a schedule, who does it, can we remind them when they are not doing it?

A: Claire Corcoran, in a similar conversation with the COB, we've been told that when volunteers start filling water bags, the contractors don't like that.

A: Todd Mistor, anything that has to do with DCR, the newly planted trees are under contract, to continue to do the watering, the contractors use an app that would record them arriving at the trees and doing the work.

Erica Holm

Watering with DCR varies by planting project, problems with gator bags being empty, unusual for us to have 80 degree days in April, 1000 trees may have a large contract, DCR updates tree maintenance manuals, they're looking at 3-5 years of maintenance. Find out what planting project it is, and who's leading it. If bags are empty, the contracts may not have started yet.

Asking about the Brooke Charter School - proposal to add the artificial turf, concerned about the implications, what it means for herself, her son and the children in the area. Aalana Feaster gave a summary of the project.

Oliver Bouchier

Brought up the artificial turf at Malcolm X park, city wide mandate to stop putting down the artificial turn. David and Aalana added their comments. The parcel in Mattapan was going through the city process, it doesn't matter who owns the land, COB residents will still be impacted, the group had references from years ago. How permanent decisions are being made about the community with outdated information is horrific. They are ignoring science or acting like it doesn't matter when it comes to certain populations.
