<u>School Delays/Snow days:</u> There will be no make-up days. If there is a school delay, there will be no Safe Sitter class that day and no make-up day. If there are any unforeseen circumstances and a class is cancelled, Students will be notified through AM/PM announcements and/or email to parents/guardians.

Please Note: This is <u>NOT</u> a Red Cross Babysitter Certification program. It is an introductory class. It is encouraged that students take additional **CPR** and **First Aid** training classes before actually starting to babysit.

Max Number of Students Per Session: There are five sessions, each running for one week only Monday thru Friday. Choose one session <u>only</u> so that other students have a chance to participate. There is a maximum of 20 students per session. Sign ups are first come, first serve. The form will close when the club is full. Only the first 20 will be enrolled. If parents accidentally enroll a child in more than one session, the child will be deleted from additional sessions. Students on the waiting list will have the opportunity to participate.

Band/Chorus Students: Students are generally excused from Band/Chorus the week of Safe Sitter's Club.
