Liberation and International Student Network (LISN)

The <u>Liberation Hub</u> will provide a much needed space for our diverse liberation groups. Accessible and inclusive by design, it is where they experience freedom; of expression, from judgement and to engage.

External Speaker Process

As of May 2023 the **Freedom of Expression Bill** was passed into law and all universities and unions must comply with the act. Official guidance won't be published until January 2024, if it's not postponed, and so we're in a bit of a limbo of trying to toe the line until we've been given more robust guidance on how to abide by this confusing bit of legislation while avoiding legal, reputational or financial risks. Yes, it is that tricky!

How does this affect you?

Inviting a trainer to deliver training in LUU? **Inviting a connection** to speak to students? **Paying a guest speaker** to motivate staff members?

Anything that involves someone from outside of LUU coming in to speak to a crowd or train staff or students needs to go through the External Speaker Process. **Sadly**, **there are no exceptions unless they're an LUU staff member**. The process for UoL staff is slightly more complicated so check in with Denica Shute.

The Better Forums, LUU's student-led policy making process is back in full swing at the start of the academic year. We're encouraging students who have Ideas on creating change within the Union, the University and Leeds as a city to submit them for other students to discuss and vote on.

Past achievements that the Student Exec have worked on in the past year as a result of Forums Policy includes drug testing kits for students, the Laidlaw Library being open 24 hours outside of term time, and exploring a working definition of Islamophobia by facilitating a roundtable with student and staff stakeholders at the University.
