November 2021 NDE-ESUCC Talking Point Summary

Office of Career, Technical, and Adult Education

- Programs of Study Updates: Business and industry leaders and postsecondary educators were engaged throughout 2021 to inform and recommend needed updates and revisions to existing State Model Programs of Study to ensure alignment with the needs of Nebraska’s evolving workforce. Recommendations were considered and needed updates were carried out. The updated Programs of Study are planned to be available in December. To allow adequate time for schools to update their courses, these programs will be implemented in the 2023-2024 school year.
- reVISION reFRESH: Perkins V stipulates that to remain eligible for Perkins funding and to participate in Perkins-funded activities, the comprehensive local needs assessment (called reVISION in Nebraska) must be updated (or, reFRESHed) at least every two years. This process is called reVISION reFRESH. reVISION reFRESH provides a meaningful opportunity to review the original reVISION outcomes, reflect on any available new data and information relative to the original needs assessment, evaluate progress towards achieving identified goals and ‘desired states’ by 2024, and determine if any modifications are needed to a district, consortium, or college’s approved four-year Perkins application. This will also serve as a time to request technical assistance from the NDE to help in achieving stated goals or closing gaps in access to high-quality CTE programs for all learners. reVISION reFRESH worksheets must be submitted to the NDE by March 15, 2022. - reVISION Action Grants: NDE received a record total of 36 reVISION Action grant applications with a total funding request of \$3,042,431. Based on the strength of the application and available funds, 17 applications were ultimately selected to receive a reVISION Action grant in 21-22 to assist in implementing the action steps needed to move their CTE systems forward. K-8 Math Acceleration Project

In the next three years, there is a continued need and opportunity to strengthen the way our educational system supports instruction and attends to unfinished learning using the NeMTSS framework. State and national data have highlighted that student learning in mathematics has been particularly affected this past year, particularly for Students with Disabilities (SWDs) and English Learners (ELs). In particular, we know that missing early foundations in math will compound future learning challenges for students in mathematics. As a result, districts, schools and educators can support unfinished learning and acceleration in mathematics so that grade-level instruction can occur while targeting support for historically underserved students through a multi-tiered system of support.

While the NDE can ensure efforts are aligned and marshal state energy and resources to provide support, our ESUs have a unique perspective on what districts truly need and how to facilitate that support. With that in mind, the NDE is seeking to work with a set of ESU and district partners to co-create, test, and continuously improve a set of approaches to strengthen K-8 mathematics instruction through a multi-tiered system of support. This work builds on high-quality instructional materials for core mathematics instruction while attending to unfinished learning so districts are equipped with individualized supports and levers to improve instruction in mathematics for all students.
