Logistic to Ukraine: current state, possibilities and resources

Position paper

This document developed by logistic experts from Ukrainian business communities for members of European Cluster Alliance.

1. Current state

Russia's war against Ukraine, Russia's attacks on critical infrastructure sectors have disastrous effects on supply chains and logistics within Ukraine affecting production capacity in Ukraine and critical logistics routes. The main problems that supply chains currently face as a result of hostilities in Ukraine include: shutting off shipping routes, key material shortages, material cost increases, production disruptions, demand volatility, etc.

Important logistics routes such as the Black Sea and Azov Sea maritime transport routes and rail and roads experience disruptions and delays, port operations in Ukraine have been practically ceased, road transport operators report blocked vehicles and cargo in Ukraine. In addition, oil and gas prices are rapidly increasing, several global logistics and freight transportation services providers halted service into and out of Ukraine, some carriers have imposed a War Surcharge, and as a result transportation and logistics costs are increasing.

Ukrainian road carriers are actively assisting the Armed Forces of Ukraine, transporting medical and humanitarian goods provided by Western partners. But the need for transportation is constantly increasing. The Armed Forces of Ukraine and volunteers are requesting to find cargo for the transportation of goods both from abroad and on the territory of Ukraine. International humanitarian organisations are being deployed in Poland to organise the transport of humanitarian cargo into Ukraine to assist people in need. They are currently looking for transport companies with a significant shipping capacity and willing to send trucks back and forth in Ukraine.

Customs processes for goods transport into Poland, Moldova, Hungary, Romania, Slovakia are open. However customs authorities are currently prioritising passenger traffic into the country, so trucks and commercial goods vehicles should expect delays.

Amid war in Ukraine, European countries have simplified travel for humanitarian aid carriers to Ukraine - Poland, Lithuania, Latvia, Slovakia, Germany and Hungary, etc. have introduced permit-free travel for humanitarian carriers to Ukraine. It means release of carriers from any additional conditions, in particular necessity of registration of permissions for the international freight transportations. EU countries have also abolished the fee for the use of roads in the case of transportation of humanitarian goods to Ukraine through their territory.

In addition, road transport organizations are calling on all governments in the region for:

 Flexibility in applying customs procedures, especially in cases where paperwork is missing due to routes having been changed;

- Waive visas, permits and driving time rules for all truck and coach drivers regardless of nationality, vehicle and cargo origin in order for them to return home as soon as possible;
- Allow humanitarian organizations, including the Red Cross and others, to include stranded drivers in their aid efforts, especially in providing water, food and warm clothing;
- Ease and ensure rapid passage of commercial vehicles, especially across borders https://www.iru.org/news-resources/newsroom/road-transport-drives-support-ukraine-crisis

2. Custom procedures

Documents for custom clearance (humanitarian aid)

Since March 23, only one document is required for this - a declaration filled out at customs. So if, when importing this category of goods, customs officers require some other permits and other documents, then you should immediately contact the hotline of the Cabinet of Ministers by phone № 1545.

You must specify the sender, recipient, actual place of unloading and type of assistance. If this is humanitarian aid to the country, then it can be sent to the OVA (regional military administration) or the relevant ministry. If the assistance is addressed to a specific community, then it is necessary to indicate its recipient.

- For medication containing controlled substances a pharmaceutical permit is required.
- For dual-use goods a permit from the Ministry of Development of Poland (for goods of Polish origin) or a permit from the exporting country is required.
- A clearly visible advertisement stating "Humanitarian Aid for Ukraine" and the image of the Red Cross must be placed on the windshield of the vehicle transporting humanitarian aid.

How can I directly deliver humanitarian aid from abroad to the warehouses of regional military administrations in Ukraine?

- 1. Contact the central warehouse of the regional military administration (see item 6 "Ukrainian hubs") and recieve contact details of the hub coordinator.
- 2. Load the cargo.
- 3. Fill in the declaration using the form adopted by the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine №329 on March 20, 2022.

NOTE: While martial law is in force, the procedure on passage of the humanitarian aid across the customs border of Ukraine is regulated by the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine №174 "On some issues regarding the passage of humanitarian aid across the customs border of Ukraine under martial law" adopted on March 1, 2022 (with amendments introduced by CMU Resolutions №329 on March 20, №235 on March 9, 2022 and №224 on March 7, 2022).

4. Main recommendations

- For containers, use Table 1, p 2
- List of logistic services and marketpalces, use Table 2 pp 3-5
- Main logistic hubs near to Ukraine (humanitarian aid), use Table 3, pp 5-6
- Requirements for the shipment of smaller cargo or single shipments (up to 1 ton). To ship such goods, we recommend using the services of Ukrainian logistics companies "Nova Poshta",
