MLB: Pittsburgh Pirates vs Milwaukee Brewers - 1 Unit (+100) - 2:10pm ET

Analysis:

Two separate 11-game winning streaks in one season is a rare feat, but that's exactly what the red-hot Milwaukee Brewers have pulled off, and it's a big reason they're running away with the NL Central. Their latest surge hit a new high last night with a 14-0 dismantling of the Pirates, a game that showcased just how dominant they've been in all facets. One constant in their recent run has been Brandon Woodruff. Since returning from the IL in early July, he's started six games, and the Brewers haven't lost a single one. Over that stretch, Woodruff has been nearly untouchable, posting a 2.29 ERA and an eye-popping 0.65 WHIP, meaning he's been limiting both baserunners and damage at an elite level. On the flip side, Pittsburgh hands the ball to Mitch Keller, one of their steadier arms, but he faces an uphill battle. The Pirates' bats have been ice-cold, managing just one total run over the first two games of this series. Without run support and facing a team this locked in, Keller's margin for error is razor-thin, and the Brewers look poised to keep the pressure on. **We got 90% of the public bets and 98% of the money on the Brewers to cover the run line.**

Blue Jays to win

Analysis:

The Cubs send rookie right-hander Cade Horton to the mound, and while his season numbers look solid with a 3.18 ERA and 1.22 WHIP over 15 appearances, the road has been far less kind to him. Horton does not overpower hitters, striking out just 18% while allowing a fair share of contact, and facing Toronto's current lineup could be a nightmare scenario. The Blue Jays are absolutely locked in at the plate, leading all of baseball in offensive production over the last 30 days with a scorching .302 team batting average across their past 25 games. It is not just the stars like Vladimir Guerrero Jr. doing damage, even the bottom of the order, including Clement, is producing big hits. Toronto counters with veteran Kevin Gausman, who has been steady with a 3.85 ERA, 1.08 WHIP, and nearly a 25% strikeout rate in 23 starts, and he has been even more dangerous at home where the Jays have gone 13-3 in their last 16, delivering an impressive +11.6-unit profit. Chicago, on the other hand, has stumbled in these spots, going just 2-8 on the road against AL starters with WHIPs of 1.30 or lower. With Toronto's bats red-hot and Gausman providing stability on the mound, this matchup heavily tilts toward the Jays, making it an uphill climb for Horton to keep the Cubs in contention.

Both the public bets and Money slightly favor Toronto coming in at 68% each.
