When the Saints were facing persecution, the Lord comforted them by saying, “Be still and know that I am God.” ([Doctrine and Covenants 101:16](#)). We can have comforting, peaceful feelings when we are being still and thinking about Jesus.

Jesus taught us how to get along with one another in 3 ways.

Way #1: Love people.

Jesus gave the two great commandments: first, to “love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind” ([Matthew 22:37](#)), and second, to “love thy neighbour as thyself” ([Matthew 22:39](#)).

The commandments to love God and to love our neighbor go together. All people really are brothers and sisters because God really is our Father.



Way #2: Forgive them.

Jesus taught us to forgive everyone, “that your Father also in heaven may forgive you” ([Mark 11:25](#)).

Way #3: Treat them the way you want to be treated.

Jesus taught the Golden Rule: “All things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them” ([Matthew 7:12](#)).
