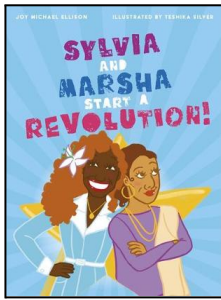


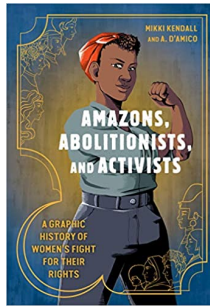

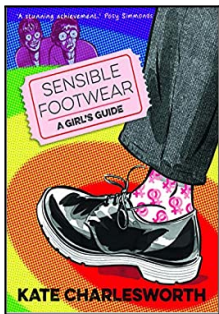
Title: *Sylvia and Marsha Start a Revolution*

Learn the story of Sylvia, Marsha and the revolution that kick-started Pride.



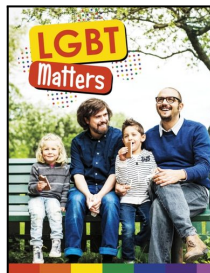
Title: *Amazons, Abolitionists and Activists*

This comic book tells the history of women's rights, starting from Ancient Times. It looks at how feminism has mixed with LGBTQ+ activism



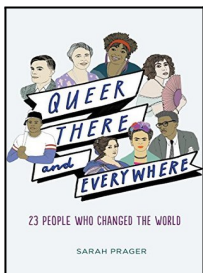
Title: *Sensible Footwear*

Charlesworth uses her own life to reflect on the history of lesbin life in Britain since the 1950s. A graphic novel mash-up of comics, collages and illustrations.



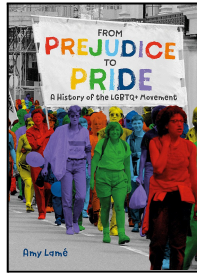
Title: *LGBT Matters*

This book is a super-simple introduction to LGBTQ terms, lives, history and rights.



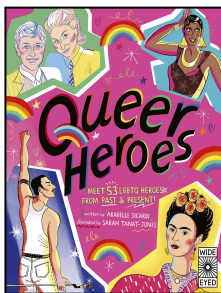
Title: *Queer, There, and Everywhere*

This book looks at 23 LGBTQ+ figures from history. With info on everything from the Roman Empire to Pop Culture.



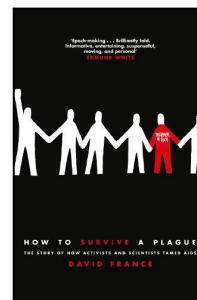
Title: *From Prejudice to Pride*

Look through the colourful portraits of 53 LGBTQ+ heroes and read short biographies of their lives. Includes Freddie Mercury, Harvey Milk and more.



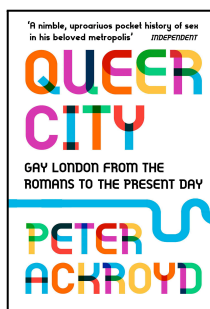
Title: *How to Survive a Plague*
