PHS Course Outline - French 2

<u>Course Overview:</u> This course is structured to emphasize all four aspects of language learning: reading, writing, speaking and listening with a heavy emphasis on meaningful communication through an immersive and interactive environment. The class is conducted 90% in the target language, focusing on language acquisition by means of comprehensible input.
