


You can use character names, settings, important objects, etc. from the book to create your word search. Here is an example of a word search: Insect Word Search</p> <p>Comprehension Questions:</p> <p>After independent reading, try answering one or more of the following questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Has the main character in the book changed? If so, how have they changed? • If you could switch places with someone in the book, who would it be and why? • Nonfiction Question: Rename a chapter or heading of the nonfiction book.
