Marching Practice

There will be a marching practice for all band members in grades 6-8 on Wednesday, May 22 *immediately after school* (early-release Wednesday) until 3:00 p.m. This is *very important* because it will be our only opportunity to combine all three grades prior to the Memorial Day Parade.

Memorial Day Parade

The Memorial Day Parade is on Monday, May 27. Band students will meet at the GMS band room at 9:00 and should be prepared with:

- Instrument
- Music and lyre
- Jeans or khakis and band shirt (if it is very warm, shorts are acceptable; if chilly, it's fine to layer up *under* the band shirt)
- ***We usually like to have a handful of parents who walk alongside the band*** in case there is someone who doesn't feel well, drops a drumstick, etc. Please contact Mrs. Cummings or Mr. Thurston if you are willing to help out.

Note: make sure that everyone is well-fed and hydrated. We want everyone to feel well and happy! 😊

Shirts and Lyres

Band students will need to purchase a shirt (our “uniform”) and a lyre (to hold the music). Mrs. Cummings will be available most mornings before school for students to drop in and pick these items up (price list is below). Checks should be made out to Greely Middle School. Please email Mrs. C or Mr. T if this creates a hardship for you.

The final band concert of the year will be on Tuesday, June 4 at 6:30 p.m. at the Greely Center for the Arts. Band students should report to the high school band room between 6:00-6:15. Attire for the concert is “dressed up,” i.e. dress pants, shirt, tie, skirt, dress, etc.
