Math: Measurement

- Measure length to the nearest non-standard unit by using the same item multiple times
- Compare and order objects by length and height using non-standard units and make statements of comparison.

- 1) Pick **only one** non-standard measuring tool (example 1 spoon, 1 marker, 1 of your hands, 1 paperclip etc.)
- 2) Using your measuring tool, measure **how long 5 items** are that you find in your house.
- 3) Record your measurements on the recording sheet below, order your items from longest to shortest and answer the thinking questions.
