Ms Adams is working with a sustainability designer from Logan Heights learning to mend, sew, and the impacts of the fashion industry. Asking for \$107 for supplies. Question: is this an ongoing project, one time thing? Answer: this would be a project in the 6th grade classes, but working on transforming it into a 6-9 week unit, with the actual project taking 1-2 weeks. Parents see teachers less frequently and there is more security, so as a parent it is hard to feel connected to the teachers and the school.
