Public Transportation Options for Occupy San Quentin, February 20th

Golden Gate Transit offers regular bus service to San Quentin from San Francisco, Marin County and Richmond (including Richmond BART). If you plan your route in advance, the system is very convenient and guite simple to use.

Below is a list of bus routes, which will be running on a holiday schedule on February 20.

**From San Francisco**, take the 70 or 80 bus heading north across the Golden Gate Bridge. The bus will make a brief stop in Marin City, but this is not your transfer point. You should stay on the bus and continue to the San Rafael Transit Center, where you'll transfer to the Eastbound 42 bus. The 42 will have "El Cerrito Del Norte BART Station" displayed on the front. This bus will take you directly to the road that leads to the East Gate at San Quentin. You can ask your driver to alert you when the bus arrives at San Quentin.

Get off the bus and make your way to the gate.

To return to San Francisco, make your way to the end of the "Point San Quentin" road (walk in the direction of the water); walk under the overpass, and cross the street to the Marin Rod and Gun Club. On the sidewalk in front of the club, you'll see a small Golden Gate Transit sign, which is where you'll wait for the bus. You'll see the bus as it approaches you from the Richmond Bridge. Hop on and ride to the San Rafael transit center. From there, transfer to the 70/80 and head back to San Francisco.

The ride from Richmond and El Cerrito is quite simple. Hop on the 42, and head across the Richmond Bridge. Look for the bus stop directly in front of the Marin Rod and Gun Club. It will be the first stop after you cross the bridge. For bus stop locations throughout Richmond, please click on the link below. This route is also convenient for BART users from the El Cerrito Del Norte and Richmond stations. To head back to the East Bay, wait at the 42 bus stop, which you will find to your right, immediately before you reach the overpass on the "Point San Quentin" road. This route will take you directly back across the Richmond Bridge.
