Initiatives Update

3 Initiatives passed by the legislature- having six initiatives on the ballot in November is risky for some of the most impactful. This will allow more resources to combat the remaining three that will be on the ballot in November.

- Ban Income Tax Current law in our constitution does not allow for an income tax already. The Office of Financial Management says there is no fiscal impact for this passing.
- Parents Bill of Rights Current law already has these provisions. Every child who is LBGTQI is protected by HIPPA laws. If there is any fallout from this, the legislature can make a fix, whereas if it passed on the November ballot the legislature cannot fix it.
- Roll back Police Pursuits The law against vehicular pursuits initially passed in 2021, but now it has been completely repealed. Most likely for political reasons.

- I-2109 repeal Capital Gains Tax This would take away 800 million to education and children.
- I-2117 Roll back Climate Commitment Act (CCA) Really important for reaching our climate goals.
- I-2124 WA Cares (Long term care) 8 billion for people who need long term care.

There will be three big campaigns for this as well as one combined one from Fuse Washington called Defend WA to take on the whole slate.

In 2024 (60 days) WILA bill trackers hosted or promoted 304 Action Alerts on 147 bills resulting in 13,714 actions being taken with an additional 2,562 click-throughs (total 16,276). 49 of the bills we actively supported were passed by the legislature.

During the past two months, state legislators in Olympia passed a stack of 359 bills that Gov. Jay Inslee has been working through signing into law this week.

Highlights: (Sen. Manka Dhingra covers those marked with (Manka) in the podcast)

Climate

- Advancing geothermal energy exploration
- Reducing Food waste in WA
- Grant program for school districts to transition to electric busses (Paid for by Climate Commitment Act) (Manka)
- Assisting with electrification of school buses.
- Banning a dangerous pesticide that harms bees.

Good Government

- Banned Child Marriage (Manka)
- Improve Working Families Tax Credit (Manka)
- Strengthened Election Security
- Banned mandatory anti-union meetings employees can opt-out without ramification
- Expansion human trafficking laws (Manka)
- Supporting sexual assault victims (Manka)
- Easier to change your address when moving between WA counties.

Education:

more funding for paraeducators

- increased support for special ed
- stopped would-be book bans
- LGBTQ+ representation in K-12 curriculum

Housing:

- \$127 million for Housing Trust Fund
- Utility bill relief for 750K households
- allow co-living housing (also known as single-room occupancy) within an urban growth area
- Cut the fat from numerous zoning regulations to unlock more kinds of homes for Washingtonians,

Gun Safety:

- Penalties for not reporting lost or stolen guns
- Gun Dealer Security measures
- Banning open carry at Libraries, zoos, aquariums, transit stations (Manka) expands laws passed in previous years
- Allowing State Patrol to destroy seized guns

Police Accountability:

banned "hog tying"

Criminal Justice Reform:

• stronger "hate-crime" laws

Healthcare:

- Protect Abortion Providers
- Expand behavioral Health Services
- Expands Basic Healthcare for undocumented immigrants (Manka) helps keep people out of using expensive ER services.

Other:

- Banning cosmetics that were tested on animals

King County has 2,700 precincts, 1,100 have PCO's, so we need 1,600 more people. 80% of PCO's are uncontested and therefore will not appear on the ballot. They are just automatically elected.
