Position Description

Penn State is seeking the most outstanding agricultural education majors to represent the profession as Penn State Teach Ag! Avengers for 2017.

Teach Ag Avengers will be responsible for being the face of the program at agricultural education and youth organization events (FFA, 4H, etc) throughout the year. It will be their job to encourage FFA members to consider a career in agricultural education by engaging students in conversations about their future career goals, answering questions about majoring in agricultural education, and portraying the profession in a positive light.

Student Benefits:

- Develop competency in advocacy for school-based agricultural education
- Provided one official PSU Teach Ag! Shirts, designed by the team and approved by the coordinator
- Provided use of iPad for duration of term as PSU Teach Ag! Avenger
- Provided mileage to all activities
- Hourly wage of \$10/hour for completion of non-event tasks
- Per Event compensation determined by PSU Teach Ag! Coordinator
- Incentive Payment of \$500 for completing the minimum 6 events with appropriate reporting and the final year-long report
- First opportunity to attend State, Regional, and National Agricultural Education Events including National FFA Convention, NAAE National Conference, PAAE Conference dependent upon available funds.

Student Obligations:

- To meet monthly as a team with the PSU Teach Ag Avenger Coordinator employed by the Center for Professional Personal Development.
- To conduct a minimum of 3 Teach Ag Events per semester per ambassador and complete post-event report. [Note: Only one ambassador may receive full credit for any one event; however partial credit can be agreed upon]
- To complete a final report by December 1st of year long experience.

Selection Process & Eligibility:

Selection for ambassadorship is a competitive process, and being selected means we believe you are one of the best and brightest future agriculture teachers. After application submittal, each candidate will be called in for a face-to-face interview. Candidates will interact with a panel to converse about serving as a Teach Ag! Avenger, as well as conduct a 10 minute presentation to the panel. Individual candidate logistics will be handled post application submittal.

Six students will be selected. Students may attend **any** campus in the Penn State system, but must be prepared for monthly team meetings at University Park, which can be attended virtually. All students selected must be declared AEE majors with intentions to teach secondary agricultural education. All student selected must be student members of PAAE. Must have 3 external references in APA format and clearly explain one strategy Teach Ag Avengers would employ to recruit the student to attend Penn State.
