Last week, on October 5th, I attended my first ISM event, a professional symposium. At this event students in the ISM program in FISD get a chance to experience mock interviews, get professional advice, and of course, get to know our fellow students and learn how their ISM experience is going through networking. Prior to the event, I prepared myself by getting my professional dress, writing and revising my résumé, and preparing questions to ask professionals about their experiences and advice as I am getting involved with the professional world. Before our stations, I networked with some professionals who I was able to link with on Linkedin, and gave me some good advice as we went into the two interview stations.

At my first station, I went to the ISM alumni room. In this room, the four women went over their time in the class, and what they got out of it. They first went over their original work projects and made suggestions like trying to do something different that could either link to your final product or something a little more unique than just a pamphlet. Next, they talked about research assessments and how it was one of their favorite parts of ISM, and how it gave them a creative outlet to dig into what they wanted to learn, and was sort of a guide into what they studied as a whole. They also went over how the skills they learned in ISM helped them into getting a job as well as how it gave them a leg up into college compared to other students. Overall, I enjoyed this room and was good guidance into how the class can affect how we go into college and the professional world.

The next thing I did was my first interview, which was with an ISM 2 student named Bhavana Sudula. Next, I went to my second interview with an IT consultant named Naresh Nirmal. In this one, he asked questions about marketing and where I see myself going in the future, which I thought was great and gave me a chance to shine in what I had been researching and explain my passion. Unfortunately, some of the questions did feel like he was not fully engaged in what I was communicating or picking apart minor details, but it was a great chance to come up with answers and experience not always having the exact right answer for when this happens in a real interview. Once again, he gave great advice on my résumé and also complimented me on my commitment and knowledge of marketing.

The next room I went to was the social media room. On this, three ISM 2 students presented both their Linkedin profiles and their digital portfolios. I enjoyed this room because it gave such a great outline of what I want my website to look like, and additionally reminded me of things to add to my Linkedin. For the website, I got to see how Khaviya, Abbie and Sam each had such unique websites that fit their personalities and goals with ISM. For mine, I want to kind of follow what I believe Abbie did, which was making a little section for each research assessment with a picture that correlates, and I also want to do some more design work and

Next, I went to the professional panel with Brad Shorgen, Eric Dunn, and Kevin Scott. The main thing I remember was Eric Dunn discussing the importance of writing a concise email, and how you have to hit the right balance of enough information without it being overkill and not interesting enough to read. I felt this room was a good reflection of how I have been communicating with professionals, and I will take what advice they had to say and put it to use in both things like emails as well as in person communication.

Student networking was the next room I went to, which I have to say was probably my favorite room out of all eight rotations. In this, I got to talk with students from Memorial, Reedy and Frisco, who all were doing such fun and unique topics and I could tell they were very passionate about what they were doing. I got to ask them about any communication they had with professionals and how their experience has been thus far, and all had great things to say and all appeared to be making wonderful progress. I loved this room because it gave me the chance to share what I have learned with other students who are in the exact position I am in, and in return getting advice and knowledge from them.
