NEW White Plains YWCA, Y Leaders Womxn Bootcamp,

Eligibility: Y Leaders is open to those who identify as female, womxn, non-binary and gender-nonconforming; currently enrolled in school; between the ages of 11 and 21; and a resident of Westchester (college addresses included).

The Y Leaders Program at YWCA White Plains & Central Westchester is a leadership initiative that aims to equip young womxn with the tools they need to be effective and empowered leaders. Our summer 2023 bootcamp program (click here for application form) will take our participants through 5 days of interactive workshops that teach you how to develop strong communication skills, create daily affirmations for good emotional wellbeing, understand your values, beliefs, priorities and passions and boldly navigate spaces with confidence and ease. CERSI is an annual event where Unitarian Universalists from mostly Ohio, Pennsylvania, New York, Maryland and other nearby states gather for a week together to learn new things, have fun, connect with old friends and make new ones. This is an event for kids, families, adults, partnered people, individuals and everyone in between. We stay in university dorms with real beds, private bathrooms and air conditioning. We have a big, grassy area between our two dorms where we have a lot of our events, eat in the dining hall, and use university buildings around campus for learning, fun, sports, swimming, and gathering.

With 32 acres and 19 buildings, Ferry Beach is a retreat community center with 1000 feet of beachfront in Saco, Maine. It is a collection of meeting spaces, wide porches, an art and pottery studio, an outdoor chapel, a performance space, many gathering places and a wonderful dining hall. Ferry Beach offers summer conference weeks for children, youth and young adults as well as individual weeks for families (all families), men, women and the LGBTQ community. Most summer conferences are weeklong events, while others may be 3-4 days. There is quilting, writing, dancing, drumming, drawing, weaving, kayaking, educating, communicating, performing, and more...workshops focusing on intergenerational families, military families, transracial families, and gay families.

Murray Grove, Camping in the Grove in Lanoka Harbor, NJ, <u>www.murraygrove.org</u> August 6-12, 2023 Youth Camp for rising 4th-7th graders August 13-19, 2023 Senior Camp for rising 8th-10th graders

Camping in the Grove offers children and youth a week-long camping experience on a beautiful 20-acre campus that is the traditional birthplace of Universalism in America. This is a sleepaway camp with a focus on community building, youth empowerment and deep fun! Come along as we make new friends, share lots of laughs, try new things, and make deeper connections to our UU community and faith. Campers are housed in our two on-site lodges and dine in our dining hall. Our unique facilities — a historic barn, the picturesque Timber Lake, spacious sport facilities, and 17 acres of undeveloped woodlands — help us offer a variety of activities. Campers will spend their days swimming, hiking, acting, doing arts & crafts, playing sports, dancing, and exploring nature. Day trips, community service projects, and special theme days help campers learn more about the world around them. Older groups will have overnight camping trips. We welcome campers aged 3 to 13 and have a Counselor-In-Training program for 14- and 15-year-olds. We believe camp should provide an opportunity for children of all backgrounds to nurture a sense of respect for one another, and to develop their strengths, knowledge, skills,
