

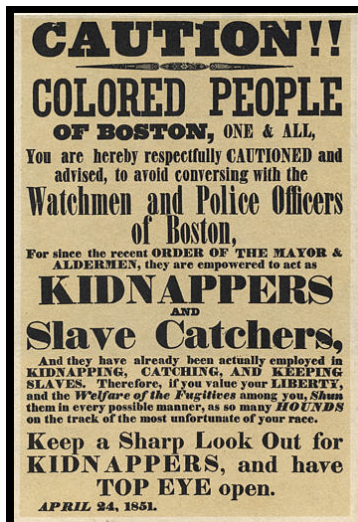
QUIZ GRADE, DUE WEDNESDAY, MARCH 20

You need **at least five** visuals for your project. If you are making a video or website, at least two of the visuals need to be video clips.

Each visual must have a caption. Your caption should

- Describe what kind of source it is and what it's about
- Give 1-2 sentence summary of the visual
- How does it relate to our topic--why is it important?

A caption example:



This poster from the 1850s was displayed in Boston before the capture of Anthony Burns. After the Fugitive Slave Law of 1850, Boston's abolitionist community was more determined than ever to stop southerners from capturing escaped slaves and returning them to the South. This image shows how far Boston abolitionists were willing to go to end slavery in the US.

Grading:

2 Points per selection of primary source - 2 for an outstanding source, 1 for a good source

2 Points per caption- 2 for a detailed caption with context, detailed summary and analysis, 1 point for partially completed or not detailed caption
