- **Before Sunday, March 10th**  
PLEASE make yourself a user name on Wikipedia. It takes 2 minutes! This will help the editing on Sunday go more quickly and smoothly. [Follow this link](#)
- **If you want to practice**  
before the big day, [here is a "game" tutorial for new editors](#). Just a way to gain familiarity. Not necessary, but fun and interesting.
- **Remember to read**  
the [wikipedia notability guidelines](#) for new persons being entered to the wikipedia canon and to bring any relevant notes or research with you. You'll want to include:
  - a.) [7-10 reliable sources](#)/links to articles about the artist
  - b.) the artist's early life and education
  - c.) the artist's career ( places worked, exhibitions etc.)
  - d.) a list of her major works

- **Please follow [THIS LINK](#)** to let us know who you are and what Jewish female artist you will be creating and/or editing a page for on Sunday, March 10th. It's great to collaborate if you are in the same room and want to work on an artist together.
- **For those joining remotely**  
The Museum will be sending you a Zoom link for use on the 10th. There will be chat available as well. It's great for asking questions and, well, "chatting" and will help our remotes feel more in the room with us.
