#### Meeting Summary

This meeting was focused on learning about conceptual models and choosing three features to start modeling with. Amy gave a short presentation explaining what conceptual models are (slides linked [here](#)). Next, the group used [Jamboard](#) to demonstrate which features they would each feel comfortable working on. After some discussion, the group decided on **Recreation**, **Connectivity**, and **Working Ranchlands** as the initial three features to build conceptual models for. #### Conceptual Models Overview

- We are moving from step 2 (convening and framing) to step 3 (assessing current conditions) of the LCD process.
- Conceptual Models are a situation analysis tool that can help us understand current conditions
- Important components include conservation targets, direct threats, and other contributing factors such as indirect threats and opportunities
- The group will eventually complete a conceptual model for every feature, but for now we will start with three

#### Which features should we start with?

- Bottom line: they are all important and things will become clearer once we work on a few.
- Feature list to choose from: recreation, aquatic resources, ecological linkage/connectivity, working ranchlands, sagebrush steppe ecosystems, healthy forest lands, alpine/subalpine ecosystems, cultural legacy, wild urban interface/fire, community economic resilience, wildlands, species of concern
- After some discussion, the group decided on **Recreation**, **Connectivity**, and **Working Ranchlands** as the initial three features to build conceptual models for. Thanks David Callister for getting the ball rolling here!
