Goals and pre-planning

The attack on the Capitol on Jan 6 appears an organized, coordinated attempt to flood the building with people and shut down the process of certifying the electoral votes. The crowd was seeded with members of organized extremist groups (e.g. Proud Boys, Three Percenters, Oath Keepers, regional militias, "Groypers" from America First) who move purposefully. We estimate at least 5% of the crowd was under orders to complete some task, though most were likely not aware of a full plan. Many had mingled at prior events, and the Nov 14 and Dec. 12 DC rallies seem important as rehearsals. Even the 'normies' (those not acting under orders, who do the bulk of the fighting) had been prepped via an extensive disinfo campaign with themes and ideas that are repeated often, in terms of language ("This is our house!" 1776!" "They work for us") and concepts ("the lawmakers are in the tunnels", "invoke the Insurrection Act"). Many were broadly aware of a plan to enter the building, and many came armed with pepper spray, knives, heavy flagpoles or other weapons; gear such as helmets, tactical vests, radios, and bullhorns. During the attack, breaches occurred abruptly, seemingly on command, instigated by a few but quickly pulling in wider participation. Attacks were organized to produce nearly simultaneous breaches on both sides of the Capitol (even despite some apparent setbacks and delays). Note: the use of a large civilian crowd to confuse defenders and achieve a strategic objective is a tactic that is now taught in military academies around the world. Specific elements of the plan on Jan 6th seemed to be:

- Attack first the less fortified, 'softer' West side of the Capitol, and let crews open the more defended East doors from the inside. The initial breach point was one of the few locations at the Capitol where windows had not been reinforced.
- Push a crowd through multiple entry points at once, on 3 different levels (basement Lower W Terrace, 1st floor W side, 2nd floor E side). (Police reinforcements may then be blocked from entering the Capitol from below, and to retake the building would have to fight through the 'civilian' crowd outside).
- At minimum, filling the building would allow legal maneuvers to overturn the election. At maximum, it would provide a chaotic crisis lawmakers trapped inside, police blocked that gave a pretext for declaring martial law. Note that initial attackers were specifically instructed not to wear identifying insignia.
- Note: while the coordinated entry points could have allowed actually intercepting evacuating lawmakers, it is not yet clear whether this was a specific goal.

Timing summary

The attack appears timed to coincide with the 1 PM start of the Joint Session to certify electoral votes, and many indications suggest it was expected to be fast, filling the Capitol perhaps within an hour. However, the advance stalled on the W. Plaza: MDP reinforcements arrived and early crowds were thin. Once the audience from Trump's Ellipse speech finally arrived, a rapid succession of organized attacks broke police lines on both sides of the Capitol, with the West-side crowd directed to move East to build up numbers there. On the West side, attackers entered the building through a carefully selected weak point, the NW Courtyard; invaders then opened several doors from inside. Once the E. Main doors were breached, mobs reached the doors of the House and Senate Chambers and the Lower W. Terrace "tunnel" within 3 minutes. At this point it appeared the attack might succeed. But, determined police held the tunnel, and the earlier delay likely bought precious time, because police and SWAT team reinforcements arrived and regained control of the Capitol interior. In the late afternoon, violent attacks resumed at the tunnel and North Doors, but without success. The fighting continued after Trump's 4:17 PM "go home" Tweet, but coordinated attacks ended around 4:30. Police retook the North Terrace, many organizers departed, and the Big Media Tower Flag on the West (a seeming attack signal) was furled. After this point, violence appears largely spontaneous and disorganized.

Coordination

Action on Capitol grounds was highly coordinated, with strategies generally low-tech but effective. Key organizers walked from West to East sides to ensure synchronized action. The crowd was steered with bullhorns, with directions likely sent over semi-public radio channels. Movements were marked by flaggers who swung flags at the edge of the action. While many people carried handheld radios, these were not used much; possibly just because cell service was still functional. At key attack points, individuals filmed on long telescoping poles, presumably to relay information to off-site observers. Several key events also seem marked by line-of-sight signals. These include: Gadsden flags hung on the E Capitol balconies (NE for the steps breach, SE for the main door breach); smoke signals and flares at the conclusion of the main attack phase, and a large flag flown first on the Media Tower and then on the Lower W. Terrace. The line-of-sight target for this flag was

possibly the Silent Majority trailer parked on the Mall, and beyond that, the group of men seen across the Potomac waiting at the Marines War Memorial. Overall, coordination was effective enough that we assume the plan was created by someone with substantial military training, likely a commissioned officer.

12:48-1:20 PM (33 minutes) **1. Invasion**

(4 breaches)

Defined as: arrival of the Proud Boys to the abortion of the first movement

Over 200 Proud Boys assembled at the Peace Monument and helped initiate an attack to seize the W. Plaza, just as the Joint Session to certify electoral votes began. Attackers raced up the walkways and took the Lower W. Plaza in minutes. They seem to have anticipated a walkover of the rest of the Plaza, but DC police reinforcements arrived quickly and halted the advance. The Capitol mob was still small, since Trump's speech was late and crowds from the Ellipse had not yet arrived.

1:21-1:49 PM (29 minutes) 2. Faceoff

(0 breaches)

Defined as: the aborted movement E to the breaching of the NW scaffolds

After the advance on the W. Plaza stalled, most Proud Boys pulled back, even while violent assaults continued. An organized motion to the East was abruptly called off, a large cross that had been carried to the front lines was pulled back, and most Proud Boys left the Plaza, including leaders who headed up the W. lawn in a "stack".

1:50-2:14 PM (26 minutes) **3. Breakthrough**

(7 breaches, 2 signals)

Defined as: breaching of the NW scaffolds to the first Capitol door opened

This period saw a breakthrough followed by rapid advances on both sides of the Capitol, aided by the growing crowd arriving from the Ellipse. A crew pushed through police under the NW Scaffolds, and organizers then moved East to initiate the breaches there, urging the crowd to go along. The Big Media Tower Flag was hoisted, and attackers seized the stairs on both sides of the Capitol in a span of 4 minutes, ran up to the "soft" NW Courtyard and smashed the unreinforced windows there to enter. By the end of this period, invaders were streaming into the Capitol from the Senate Wing Door on the West, and a mob crowded the East Main Doors.

2:15-2:48 PM (34 minutes) 4. Multi-pronged attack

(10 breaches, 5 signals)

Defined as: from the first to the last major breaches of a Capitol door.

This period saw attempts to flood the building from multiple breaches. Invaders from inside threw open the E Main Doors, and attackers re-breached doors in the NW Courtyard that police had closed. On the W. Plaza, police lines were broken in a swift rush and the mob raced up to the tunnel, police retreating before them. Inside the building, one group pushed down to the Visitors' Center, one group raced to the Senate (and entered), and another tried to breach the House (where Ashli Babbitt was shot). The advances were marked by smoke signals and a flare. Once the last breach was completed, the Big Media Tower Flag was furled and lowered from the tower.

2:49-3:01 PM (13 minutes) **5. Failing to fill the interior** (0 breaches, 1 signal) Defined as: the last major door breach to officers enter the Rotunda
This period is the turning point when the plan to overwhelm the Capitol building failed. Police held the tunnel, and early entrants - largely unarmored and unprepared for a fight - had to pull back. Their "heave-ho" efforts to push together were also unsuccessful. Inside the Capitol, police herded the mob from the House downstairs and pushed them out. FBI SWAT arrived and entered the building. By the end of this period, the momentum had decisively shifted.

3:02-3:30 PM (29 minutes) 6. Police pushback

(1 breach, 0 signals)

Defined as: officers enter the Rotunda to the Rotunda cleared

Police largely cleared the Capitol interior during this period. MPD and tactical units herded intruders into the Rotunda from all directions, then pushed them out of the building. A breach of the N. Doors was quickly repelled. On the Lower W. Terrace, police pushed back to the tunnel mouth and Officer Fanone was dragged into the mob.

3:31-4:30 PM (60 minutes) 7. Late strategic fighting

(1 breach, 1 signal)

Defined as: the Rotunda cleared to the end of an organized attack

After a pause, violent attempts to breach the building resumed at the tunnel and North Doors, now featuring tougher, more well-equipped men. At the tunnel, the frustrated mob finally broke a window, but police inside announced they would use lethal force. Trump's 4:17 PM 'go home' Tweet had little effect; fighting continued

through a vicious attack - possibly an attempt to rescue trapped intruders - in which Rosanne Boyland died and Officer Miller was dragged into the mob. The Big Media Tower Flag was re-flown near the tunnel during this phase, but by 4:30 PM it was furled and removed. This seems to mark the end of any organized, purposeful attacks.

4:31-6:14 PM (1 hr 45 mins) 8. Securing the Capitol

Defined as: the end of an organized attack to the Capitol declared secure

During this period law enforcement regained control of the Capitol exterior grounds. Police swept the North Terrace, pushing a large angry crowd including many militiamen onto the NE Plaza and NE Path. A frustrated mob then attacked journalists and their equipment in the NE Media Pen. Violent but seemingly directionless fighting continued at the tunnel til after 5 PM. The DC National Guard was finally deployed, but contributed little. The Capitol grounds were fully secured by 6:14 PM.

Wherever possible, timing is made from synchronized multi-camera video. When conflicts exist between Parler times and CCTV or police bodycam we use the CCTV/body cam as the reference. Conflicts can be as large as several minutes, but most times are known to seconds. We term all multicam syncs as primary sources. Other primary sources include the timing for evacuation of VP Pence and Senators, taken from security footage shown in impeachment hearings 2/10/2021.
