



You've heard taking the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is your ticket to a great U.S. military career. If you're serious about joining the military, then it's time to get serious about taking the ASVAB by using <u>ASVAB practice tests</u>.

The ASVAB is a timed, multi-aptitude test, which is given at more than 14,000 schools and <u>Military Entrance Processing Stations (MEPS)</u> nationwide.

You can start preparing now by taking our ASVAB practice tests (click or tap on the test links in the header above). These tests will give you an idea of how you'll score and identify areas for improvement. Then, use our suggested resources and ASVAB study guides to learn how to prepare for the ASVAB test.

PSATS!!!!!

Attention Sophomores and Juniors!! On Wednesday, October 9th, 2024, all MCPS 11th grade students will take the Digital Preliminary SAT at no cost. The benefits of taking the PSAT as juniors include: providing practice taking the SAT; identifying skills for improvement; increasing participation in Advanced Placement Programs; providing online college and career planning tools; encouraging students to challenge themselves; providing links to free, personalized SAT practice programs; to gain additional practice before taking the SAT in the spring of their junior year. Juniors who take the PSAT may be eligible to compete for scholarships in the National Merit Scholarship Program.

The cost for sophomores to take the PSAT is \$18, payable by cash, check or money order to AHS.

Thinking about college? Workforce? Still not sure? It's never too early to start preparing. Your search for opportunities following high school begins with habits you form now. **EVERYONE** can start with these simple but important steps:

- Attendance be here. Setting this habit early will carry over and help in the workplace AND in the college classroom.
- Stay organized there are lots of tools, tips and tricks to help with this. If you're not sure where to begin, talk with your teachers, parents and/or your school counselor.
- Keep up with your work turning assignments in on time, being prepared for tests, asking questions if you don't understand....keep up with powerschool, google classroom, remind. Remember, you are responsible for your grades, but the adults in your life can help.
- Preparation goes hand in hand with organization and work completion. Don't have what you need? Not sure where to start? Come on down, your school counselors are here to help!
- Know your resources sometimes, things get hard. That's part of life. Inside and outside of school, things outside of our control can make it difficult to do what we need to do. Your teachers/administrators/counselors are here to help.

NASA STEM OPPORTUNITIES

FREE NASA STEM programs for high school students in grades 10-12. These programs provide unique opportunities for students interested in space exploration, climate science, and NASA missions to engage deeply with these subjects through online courses AND in-person residential experiences at NASA facilities.

We're excited to announce that applications for our programs—Virginia Space Coast Scholars (VSCS), Virginia Aerospace Science and Technology Scholars (VASTS), and Virginia Earth System Science Scholars (VESSS)—are now open. Applications close on October 24th.

About Our Programs:

1. <u>Virginia Space Coast Scholars (VSCS)</u> – 10th Grade:

VSCS is a FREE program for high school sophomores focusing on the science, technology, engineering, and math integral to current missions at NASA's Wallops Flight Facility and the Mid-Atlantic Regional Spaceport. Scholars participate in an online course from November to March, gaining insights into NASA's innovative work. Top-performing students are invited to a 7-day residential summer academy at NASA Wallops, where they collaborate on mission design projects.

2. <u>Virginia Aerospace Science and Technology Scholars (VASTS)</u> – 11th & 12th Grade: VASTS centers on human space exploration. Scholars design upgrades for the ISS, create a new crew exploration vehicle, and engage in space-related discussions. The program follows a similar

format to VSCS, with online coursework and a summer academy at NASA Langley Research Center.

3. Virginia Earth System Science Scholars (VESSS) – 11th & 12th Grade:

VESSS focuses on NASA's climate change research, exploring satellite missions that enhance our understanding of Earth's systems. Scholars participate in an online course and a summer academy at NASA Langley, much like VASTS.

The Society of Women Engineers at the University of Virginia invites high schoolers to apply to our High School Visitation program on Saturday, October 19th, 2024. The program gives young women (cis and trans) and non-binary high school students a comprehensive look at engineering fields and UVA's engineering curriculum through informative speakers and interactive design activities. The program is designed to benefit participants with all levels of engineering experience, but we particularly target those students who are not yet familiar with the field and may be interested in applying to engineering schools or pursuing a STEM career.

To apply, students should complete the HSV Fall 2024 Application which can be found here. Students who have previously applied to HSV, are in the targeted grade level, and demonstrate a strong interest in engineering through their short answer question will receive priority acceptance. The event is planned to be held in-person at the UVA campus in Charlottesville, VA. The Coke Scholars Application is Open for High School Seniors

Each year, the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation awards 150 college scholarships worth \$20,000 to high school students across the United States through the Coca-Cola Scholars Program.

Students need a 3.0 GPA and to complete an online application that requires no essays, no recommendations, and no transcripts by September 30, 2024, at 5 p.m. Eastern.

TAG — Tuition Assistance Grant — The TAG program of the Commonwealth of Virginia provides annual grants to Virginia residents who are full-time students at eligible, non-profit, private colleges and universities in Virginia. The award amount is based on the number of eligible students and the amount of funds appropriated by the General Assembly. If you are applying to a private college in Virginia, be sure to ask the admissions or

financial aid office of your college for a TAG application.

THE JEFFERSON SCHOLARS FOUNDATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA invites seniors at Auburn High School to participate in the 2024—2025 competition for Jefferson Scholarships to the University of Virginia. Jefferson Scholarships — full scholarships to the University — are granted to individuals on the basis of merit-alone; financial need is not a consideration in the selection process. The Foundation pays directly to each recipient a stipend sufficient to cover the full cost of attending the University. AHS is asked to nominate one student from the senior class who best exemplifies excellence in the Jeffersonian ideals scholarship and citizenship. The Jefferson Scholars Foundation seeks to identify the most highly talented students in the world, and all that is asked of these students is a willingness to participate fully in the selection process. Prior interest in the University of Virginia and financial need should not be factors in selecting a nominee. The Jefferson Scholars Foundation does require as a condition of nomination that each nominee agree not to make an application to a college or university under a binding early decision plan. Any senior who wishes to apply to a college or university under a non—binding early admission plan would be eligible to compete and win a Jefferson Scholarship.
