Declaration of Authorship

This movement is porous, plural, and unfinished. Evolution is welcome when rooted. It critiques hegemonies but refuses to become one.
4. **Against Institutional Flattening**
Its power circulates not just in galleries or journals—but in footnotes, zines, oral memory, and counter-publics. Institutional polish must not dull its edge.
5. **Beyond Perpetual Victimhood**
Emerging from colonial trauma, this minimalism carries survivance, speculative repair, and quiet joy. It's not a mourning veil—it's a portal.
