2. Export as MP4.
3. Open your screencast in your Google Drive.
4. Click on the three vertical dots in upper righthand corner and select "Share."
5. Click on "Get Shareable Link."
6. Change setting to "Anyone with Link can View."
7. Copy and paste address.
8. **Link it to your name in the [class document](#) by 11:59 pm this Wednesday, Dec 16th.**
