Phillip Wade: Supply list Landscape to Abstract

Note: if working very large, you will need more paint and bigger brushes.

(Approximate Cost - \$70 - \$100)

PLEASE CHOOSE TO WORK IN EITHER OIL OR ACRYLIC.

Buy student grade paint which is much less expensive (eg. Lukas, Academy Oils, Winton, Soho, Galleria acrylics) in medium-size tubes except for white-buy a large tube.

I advise against buying the Basics brand in acrylic, or the Georgian brand in oils.

SUGGESTED COLORS FOR OIL AND ACRYLIC STUDENTS:

Titanium white (Lukas, Permalba, Soho, Winton Soft-Mixing White, these are good oil brands)

Cadmium yellow light (or pale or lemon) hue

Cadmium red light hue,

Alizarin crimson

Ultramarine blue,

Burnt sienna

Pthalo blue

Optional colors: yellow ochre, cadmium yellow medium hue, permanent green light, cadmium orange hue, cobalt violet hue (or other violet), sky blue, magenta

Palette knife Paper towels

Masking tape

Soft vine charcoal (optional: you can draw with paint).

Medium sandpaper for sanding canvas (optional).

Shallow container (such as a tuna can) for turpenoid or water

Disposable paper palette (12"X16"), OR Reynolds Freezer Paper for palette, Brushes -flats(square cut) or Filberts(rounded top) Three brushes in different sizes, from small to one inch to 1 1/2-inch wide, don't buy the really expensive ones! Prostroke brushes are very good, also Ebony Splendor, Princeton, Robert Simmons, and Qualita.

Canvas: 12x16 on up, you decide.

FOR OIL PAINTING

Oil paint medium, such as Liquin (this has gotten expensive, so optional) Turpenoid (NOT "Turpenoid Natural") or Gamsol.

FOR ACRYLIC PAINTING

Mist/spray bottle - very important!

2 shallow containers for water
