

PART ONE: STATE SYMBOLS



TEXAS STATE BIRD



- the mockingbird is able to imitate the song of many other birds.
- the female lays 3 to 5 blue-green eggs with brown spots.
- the mockingbird was adopted as Texas' state bird in 1927.

TEXAS STATE FLOWER



- The Bluebonnet ("Lupinus texensis") is a perennial in warm climates and an annual in colder areas.
- The Bluebonnet blooms in the early spring and can be easily found in fields and along roadsides throughout Texas.
- Adopted as the state flower of Texas in 1901.

TEXAS STATE MOTTO

The Texas state motto is FRIENDSHIP. "Tejas" is a Caddo Indian word meaning "friend" - "friendship" is in our name! In the space above, draw a picture or write about what being a good friend means to you.

TEXAS STATE SONG

The state song is "Texas, Our Texas" by William J. Marsh and Gladys Yoakum Wright. The lyrics are:

Texas, our Texas! All hail the mighty State!

Texas, our Texas! So wonderful so great!

Boldest and grandest, Withstanding ev'ry test;

O Empire wide and glorious, You stand supremely blest.

[Refrain] God bless you Texas! And keep you brave and strong, That you may grow in power and worth, Thro'out the ages long.

When the state flag is displayed during a performance of "Texas, Our Texas", all individuals present, except those in uniform, should stand at attention facing the flag with the right hand over the heart. Individuals in uniform should salute at the first note of the song, and retain this position until the last note. Individuals who are wearing a headdress that is easily removeable should remove it with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, with the hand over the heart. Individuals who are not citizens of Texas should simply stand at attention.
